



Executing the Maritime Strategy

"NAVCENT and coalition forces maintain a considerable and continuous presence in the Gulf region in order to promote a secure maritime environment, lower the vulnerability threshold of the Strategic Lines of Communication and the choke points, and ensure they remain free from threat of closure."

Around the world, the Navy is executing the core capabilities of the Maritime Strategy; examples from November include:

Forward Presence

- The George H.W. Bush Carrier Strike Group flew 133 sorties totaling 606 hours in support of operations New Dawn and Enduring Freedom and maritime security operations (MSO) in the U.S. 5th Fleet area of responsibility (AOR).
- Naval Fleet Auxiliary Force ships attached to Commander, Task Force 53 conducted 74 replenishments-at-sea with 39 different ships from eight countries while operating in support of U.S. 5th Fleet missions.

Maritime Security

- Guided missile destroyer <u>USS Kidd (DDG 100)</u> continued to serve as Combined Maritime Forces' Combined Task Force (CTF) 151 flagship. CTF 151 is led by Pakistani Rear Adm. Kaleem Shoukat.
- <u>High Speed Vessel (HSV) 2</u> Swift arrived in Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic, as part of <u>Southern Partnership</u> Station 2012.

Deterrence

- The Makin Island Amphibious Ready Group (ARG) and embarked Marines of the 11th Marine Expeditionary Unit (MEU) entered the U.S. 7th Fleet AOR. Command ship USS Makin Island (LHD 8) is on its maiden deployment.
- <u>USS Texas (SSN 775)</u> made a port call at <u>Commander Fleet Activities Yokosuka</u> during the Thanksgiving holiday as part of its Western Pacific deployment.

Power Projection

- <u>USNS Sacagawea (T-AKE 2)</u> conducted replenishments-at-sea with French, German and Australian naval ships while supporting counter-piracy operations in the Gulf of Aden.
- Sailors from Riverine Squadron (RIVRON) 2, Det. 2, deployed to Bahrain in support of CTF 56, marking the first operational deployment of the riverine command boat (RCB).

Building Maritime Partnerships

- <u>U.S. Naval Forces Central Command (NAVCENT)</u> hosted the Naval War College's Combined Force Maritime Component Commander (CFMCC) Course for senior international military officers on board Naval Support Activity Bahrain.
- Military Sealift Command (MSC) oceanographic survey ship <u>USNS Henson (T-AGS 63)</u> completed a month-long, bilateral survey mission with the Indonesian navy.

Humanitarian Assistance / Disaster Response

- <u>USS Tortuga (LSD 46)</u> relieved <u>USS Lassen (DDG 82)</u> in Laem Chebang, Thailand, to continue support of Marine Corps Forces Pacific <u>flood relief efforts</u>.
- Maritime Civil Affairs Team (MCAT) 205, in Kenya, helped evacuate a critically ill child from Faza to Lamu, 25 miles away, after Kisingitini villagers asked for help evacuating the child because of tidal flooding.
