What is residual waste?

Items that cannot be recycled such as trash, sanitary waste, special papers like pan liner or towels ashes, disposable diapers, vacuum cleaner bags, dirty packaging, rubbish, toys, textiles, writing materials except papers and cardboards, plastic except packaging, construction debris, bags, medicine, cat litter, solvent-less paint, detergent etc.

Pick-up Schedule Bi-weekly



Organic Waste- Biomüll (trash bin with green cap)

What is organic waste?

Items such as leftovers, eggshells, coffee filter, tea bags, vegetable and fruits, tree-, bush-, and hedge-clippings, flowers and plants, leaves, grass-clippings, and weeds.

Non-recyclable material include:

Soup, salad dressings, hay, straw, shavings, cat litter, wood, treated miscellaneous waste, and packaging.

Pick-up Schedule bi-weekly

Tip: Use newspapers or paper bags for wrapping.

Do not use plastic bags or sheeting, even if labeled as bio-degradable, decomposable or "*Biobeutel*" for collection.



Waste Paper / Cardboard – Altpapier (trash bin with blue cap)

What is waste paper?

Items such as books, catalogs, newspapers, magazines, periodicals, papers, correspondence, handouts, notes, wrapping paper, boxes and packing material made of cardboard.

Non-recyclable material include:

coated and wet strength paper, coated packaging, folder, organic and mineral contaminated paper, diapers, vacuum cleaner bags, wallpaper, egg boxes



Remove all tapes, plastic sheet, adhesive tape or similar

Pick-up Schedule monthly, or deliver to collection points at recycling centers

Glass- Altglas

What is waste glass?

Only nonreturnable container made of clear, brown or green glass labeled as glass for recycling without caps.

What is not waste glass?

Returnable bottles, windows, crystalline glass, spectacles and mirror glasses, dishes, and bulbs.

Collection Points

Consolidated containers at 320 public places and at recycling centers labeled for clear, brown and green glass.

Hours to Throw-in: 8 a.m. to 7 p.m.

Bulky Waste – Sperrmüll



What is bulky waste?

Residual waste that is too big for the gray trash bin, but does not exceed 2 m x 1.2 m x 0.8 m Weight ≤ 60 kg each. For example, mattresses, cupboards, bedframe, furniture, carpets, mirrors, suitcases, ski and surfboards.

What is not bulky waste?

Cardboard, paper, plastic packaging, TV, refrigerators, vacuum cleaner, wood treated with wood preservation agent, hazardous waste, and construction debris.

Pick-up Schedule

On demand, with a voucher free of charge, 4 times a year up to 0.5 m³

Lead time: 3 weeks

Express bulky waste within 3 working days

Note: Waste not classified as bulky waste will not be collected.

Red Bag - Roter Sack

What goes into the red Bags?

only small Electronic Scrap e.g., cell phones, hair dryer, shaver, and CD's and DVD's

How to get red bags? Distributed at Böblingen-Hulb, Herrenberg-Kayh, Leonberg, Renningen-Malmsheim, Waldenbuch/Steinbronn, and Jettingen.

Pick-up Schedule 12 times per year, see pick-up schedule for recycling bins

Recycling Bin - Wertstofftonne



What goes into the recycling bin?

Things made of metal, plastic, wood such as pots, pans, tools, toys, chopping boards, buckets, watering pots, bowls, colanders, baskets, cups, and boxes

What does not go into the recycling bin?

Large electronic scrap, fluorescent lamps, energy saving bulbs, glass, dishes, batteries and accumulators, hazardous waste, waste, tapes, music and video tapes, textiles, vehicle parts, construction debris, CD's, DVD's

Pick-up Schedule

12 times per year, see pick-up schedule for recycling bins charged: 3,50 €/Pick-up

Non-recyclable material include:

coated and wet strength paper, coated packaging, folder, organic and mineral contaminated paper, diapers, vacuum cleaner bags, wallpaper, egg boxes

Remove all tapes, plastic sheet, adhesive tape or similar

Pick-up Schedule monthly, or deliver to collection points at recycling centers



Pick-up Schedule

In general: 3-week intervals

Exception: bi-weekly in the districts of Birkach,

Degerloch, Möhringen, Plieningen,

Sillenbuch, and Vaihingen

Organic Waste- Biomüll (brown trash bin)

What is organic waste?

Organic waste of the kitchen/garden, e.g. solid, uncooked Leftovers (e.g. Bread, Cheese), Eggshells, Coffee Filter, Tea Bags, uncooked Vegetable and Fruits, Tree-, Bush-, and Hedge-Clippings, Flowers and Plants, Leaves, Grass-Clippings, Weed, Pet Hairs, Paper Towels, Wood (in small amounts), Nutshells, Christmas Trees without Decoration, etc.



Non-Recyclable Material

Organic and mineral Trash (Hay, Straw, Shavings, Cat Litter etc.) from small Animals, Meat and Sausages, cooked Leftovers, Bones, Wood, treated miscellaneous Waste, etc.

Pick-up Schedule

May – October weekly
November – April bi-weekly

Tip

use newspapers or paper bags for wrapping, never use plastic bags for collection



Yellow Bag / Mixed Plastic - gelber Sack



What goes into the yellow bag?

All empty sales packaging, e.g. plastic Shopping Bags and Sheeting, (Yoghurt) Cups, Detergent Bottles, Styrofoam, Tubes, Caps, Sheeting and Packaging made of Aluminium, (Beverage) Cans, Metal Cans, Lids, Caps, Tubes made of Metal, Composite Materials like Beverage Plastic Packing and Bubble Wrap, etc.

Non-Recyclable Material household Waste, Paper and Cardboards, Glass

Pick-up Schedule 3-weekly intervals

How to get yellow bags? in shops (e.g. Edeka, Real) and from garbage trucks

Note: wrong packed yellow bags will be labeled and not picked up.

Glass- Altglas

What is glass?

Only nonreturnable container made of clear, brown or green glass labeled as glass for recycling without caps.

What is not glass?

Returnable bottles, windows, crystalline glass, spectacles and mirror glasses, dishes, and bulbs.

Collection Points

Consolidated containers at public places labeled for clear, brown and green glass. For location ask your landlord

Note: Sometimes used cloth can be also dropped off at containers which are in the vicinity of the glass containers. These containers are clearly labeled as "Altkleider" and they are often provided by non-profit- organization.



Bulky Waste - Sperrmüll





What is bulky waste?

Residual waste that is too big for the gray trash bin, but does not exceed 2 m x 1.2 m x 0.8 m Weight \leq 60 kg each. For example, mattresses, cupboards, bedframe, furniture, carpets, mirrors, suitcases, ski and surfboards.

What is not bulky waste?

Cardboard, paper, plastic packaging, TV, refrigerators, vacuum cleaner, wood treated with wood preservation agent, hazardous waste, and construction debris.

Pick-up Schedule

On demand/bulky waste enrollment, twice a year free of charge

Lead time: 3 through 6 weeks

Express bulky waste within 48 hours, charges

For more information ask your landlord

Note: Waste not classified as bulky waste will not be collected and has to be disposed by yourself

Hazardous Waste - Problem-/Gefahrstoffe

What is hazardous waste?

Items such as energy saving bulbs, accumulators and batteries, all kind of chemicals, liquid varnish and paint, solvent, rust remover, pesticides, empty waste oil cans, aerosol cans with residual content.

What is not Hazardous Waste? Items such as starter batteries, dishwasher, cooker, refrigerator, heater, monitor, computer, cell phones and coffee makers.



Collection Point

Deliver to the "Umweltmobil". For the pickup schedule ask your landlord, for batteries/accumulators see public facilities and shops.

How to Transport to Recycling Vicinity?

In leak-proof closed container, max. volume 5 Liters; the content shall be clearly identifiable by labels or packing.



Schedule

Several times a year, for dates ask your landlord or take to the Wertstoffhof Burgholzstraße 31/1, Stuttgart-Münster. Every 3rd Saturday of the month between 8 a.m. to 1 p.m.

Recyclable Waste "Flat" - "Flach" (green trash bin)





What is recyclable waste "Flat"?

Items such as softcovers, catalogs, newspapers, periodicals, envelopes, correspondence, handouts, wrapping paper, boxes, bags and packing material made of cardboard, corrugated cardboard or plastic, plastic bags, foils, and Styrofoam.

What is not recyclable waste "Flat"?

Items such as organic and mineral contaminated paper and cardboard, hardcovers, styrofoam chips, no recyclable waste "round", and non-emptied packing material.

Pick-up Schedule 4-week intervals

Support local clubs and provide newspapers and periodicals, bonded or packed in cardboard on pick-updates.

Recyclable Waste "Round" -"Rund" (green trash bin)





What is recyclable waste "round"?

All empty sales packaging, such as yoghurt cups, detergent bottles, sheeting and packaging made of aluminum, beverage cans, metal cans, lids, caps, composite materials like beverage plastic packing, vacuum packaging like coffee, empty aerosol cans, glass, nonreturnable container made of clear, brown, or green glass etc.

Non-Recyclable waste "round"

Is trash, paper and cardboards, recyclable waste "flat"

Pick-up Schedule 4-weekly intervals

Organic Waste-Biogut (brown trash bin)

What is organic waste?

Items such as leftovers, eggshells, coffee filters, tea bags, vegetable and fruits, tree, bush and hedge clippings, flowers and plants, leaves, grass-clippings, and weeds.

Non-recyclable material includes:

Soup, salad dressings, hay, straw, shavings, cat litter, wood, treated miscellaneous waste, and packaging.

Pick-up Schedule bi-weekly

Tip

use newspapers or paper bags for wrapping, never use plastic bags for collection

Tree-, bush- and hedge-clippings may be delivered to the "Häckselplätze".



Bulky & Electronic Waste, Scrap Metal - Sperrmüll



What is bulky/electronic waste?

Waste too big for the gray trash bin such as furniture, beds, mattresses, shelves, bedframe, stoves, washing machines, dish washer, electronic waste such as monitors, refrigerators and bicycles.



Items such as recyclable waste, cardboard, wallpaper, hazardous waste, tires, vehicle parts, debris, windows, doors, wood paneling, and objects for disposal that has a volume of more than 5 m³.



Pick-up Schedule

Twice a year free of charge

Postcards to apply for pick-up dates will be sent to household/landlord annually

Pre-positioning of waste on curb-side the night before or prior 6:00 a.m.

For more information, ask your landlord.

Note: Electronic waste can always be delivered to recycling centers free of charge. maximum weight: 50 kg, maximum length: 2 m.

Waste made of wood shall be separately pre-positioned from other bulky waste.

Hazardous Waste - Schad-/Gefahrstoffe

What is hazardous waste?

Items such as energy saving bulbs, accumulators and batteries, all kind of chemicals, liquid varnish and paint, solvent, rust remover, pesticides, empty waste oil cans, aerosol cans with residual content.

What is not Hazardous Waste? Items such as starter batteries, dishwasher, cooker, refrigerator, heater, monitor, computer, cell phones and coffee maker.



Collection Point

Deliver to the "Umweltmobil" at Ludwigsburg Tammerfeld, Maybachstrasse, Wendeplatte, 71634 Ludwigsburg, every month on Saturday between 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. or Wertstoffhof Wasserturm, Am Wasserturm 11, 70806 Kornwestheim, Almost every month on Saturday between 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.



Schedule

Several times a year For dates ask your landlord.

Tip

Stone-empty aerosol cans are recyclable waste "round"
Waste oil is accepted by specialist companies not at the "Umweltmobil"
For batteries/accumulators see public facilities and shops as well
