Dear Mr. Serio:

I hereby request emergency authorization to create marsh barriers in Blind and Customhouse Bays (north and south of Pass A Loutre) using sediment hydraulically dredged from Pass A Loutre. The purpose of this project is to increase flow down Pass A Loutre in order to provide a "head" of freshwater to combat wind/current driven oil in addition to the creation of marsh barriers to shield the interior marshes from oil intrusion. The Mississippi River Delta was the first land area impacted by the Deepwater Horizon oil and protecting this area from further impact is extremely critical to the long-term viability of the Delta.

The proposed work area is shown on the attached drawings.

Mr. Ducote,

The Corps Engineering Division(ED), Hydraulics Section who are tasked with keeping the Mississippi River navigation channels open for commerce have concerns based on hydraulic studies and analysis indicating that opening up Pass A Loutre would divert a substantial amount of current energy from South and Southwest passes thereby creating problems in maintaining those two main navigation channels to their current depths, which currently accommodate international maritime traffic. If the State wants to proceed with this application, as proposed, it will have to be done by the Standard Permit method which will allow the Corps the proper time to coordinate with the USCG, the various river pilots associations and others concerned with the navigation channels of the river. We anticipate an extensive amount of additional information for this coordination and for the Corps ED to complete a thorough review.

If the State wants to submit revised plans for dredging Pass A Loutre where the dredging would not exceed two miles east of the river channel the Corps would proceed with processing this application under our emergency permit procedures.

Mr. Tewis

I was forwarded a copy of the electronic mail below by Mr. Karl Morgan, Administrator, Permits and Mitigation Division, Office of Coastal Management. I am not certain that I understand your options and whether or not there is really much difference. I believe I understand the difference between processing as an emergency use as opposed to a Standard Permit however I think that the email begs several questions;

- 1) Why do you want the area to be dredged reduced? You gave no reason.
- 2) Should not the merits of the project dictate whether or not it should be granted?
- 3) Of what significance is it to the NOD what the channel configuration or size is?

- 4) Are you implying that if the state does not reduce the area to be dredged that the application will then be processed as a Standard Permit?
- 5) What exactly does that mean i.e. considerably more time before it is approved?
- 6) If we reduce the area of dredging would it be processed as an emergency?
- 7) If so, what is the NOD's threshold for reduction before it goes from emergency use to Standard Permit? Alternatively, what can the state have under an emergency authorization?
- 8) Your # 3) begs a couple of questions as well. To wit;
- 1) Is the Engineering Division (ED) setting the parameters for the size/amount of the proposed dredging?
- 2) Would the ED still object to the permit if the state reduced the amount/size of dredged area?
- 3) What authority does the ED have to summarily demand denial of a permit?
- 4) How many permits and which ones are they that the ED has "denied" to date?

Our Engineering Division (ED) has reviewed your application to dredge Pass A Loutre and construct berms on either side of the pass (Corps file # MVN-2010-01783-ETT). ED determined that the extent of dredging in Pass A Loutre should be no further than mile 2 in the pass, at a point just west of Cheniere Pass, the first major bifurcation in the Pass A Loutre. Therefore we are unable to process this request as an emergency permit at this time. In lieu of a denial of your current request, other options for you to consider are:

- 1.) Submit revised drawings showing the extent of dredging not to exceed 2 miles east of the river channel, in Pass A Loutre. This will require submittal of a Standard Permit (SP) application within thirty days of receiving authorization, if granted or,
- 2.) You can withdraw the emergency request and resubmit it as Standard Permit application. This may require additional information for a public notice etc.




