MEMORANDUM FOR ALL Parks Reserve Forces Training Area, Soldiers and Civilians

SUBJECT: PFTA Policy#19, Recycling Program

1. REFERENCES.

- a. Executive Order 13514, Federal Leadership in Environmental, Energy, and Economic Performance, 5 October 2009.
- b. 10 U.S.C. 2577, Disposal of Recyclable Materials.
- c. Integrated Solid Waste Management Plan, Parks Reserve Forces Training Area, prepared by USACHPPM, January 2003.
- d. Qualified Recycling Program Plan, Prepared by Engineering and Environment, Inc., April 2004.

2. PURPOSE. To provide guidance to Civilian and military personnel regarding the Parks Reserve Forces Training Area (PRFTA) recycling program.

3. APPLICABILITY. These procedures are applicable to Civilian, contractors, military and all other personnel assigned to and under the operational control of the PRFTA Commander.

4. POLICY. DoD Instruction 4715.4, Pollution Prevention, 18 June 1996. Sets the policy on solid waste diversion and recycling, and the above references expands on the instruction.

a. Support the recycling program by identifying, collecting, separating, and removing contaminants from all recyclable materials. Camp Parks recycles cardboard, white paper, mixed paper, newspaper, magazines, aluminum cans, plastic bottles, scrap metal, and standard size wooden pallets.

b. Before moving a recycling container from its assigned location, contact the Recycling Coordinator. The user is responsible for property accountability for items such as recycling containers issued from the Recycling Coordinator.

c. Garrison owned recycling bins are used for the collection of recyclable materials only, and all recyclables collected must be turned in to the PRFTA recycling program.

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d. Do not “dump” any materials at, or outside the Recycling Center (building 133). To schedule a drop-off, contact the Recycling Coordinator.
