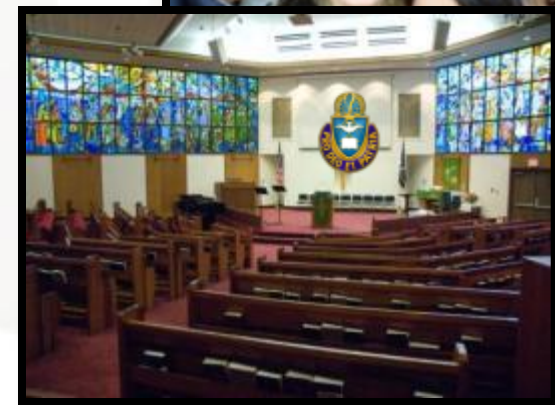
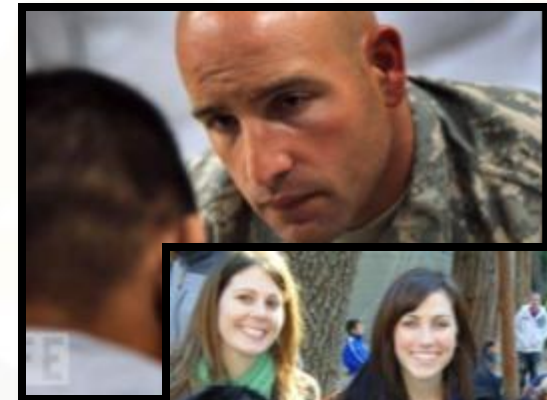

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Adolescent Substance Abuse Counseling Service (ASACS)



- The program, initiated in 1987, is funded by the Army Center for Substance Abuse Programs (ACSAP), and is a garrison asset, embedded in the schools.
- Services provided for sixth through twelfth graders, at the middle and high schools.
- Services include prevention and treatment.
- Individual, group, and family counseling.
- Adolescents need not be substance involved to benefit from services. Counseling also addresses risk factors.
- Confidentiality is strictly protected by federal regulations.
- ASACS Counselors are licensed in their respective counseling disciplines and hold certifications in the addictions field.

Spice...

Myths and Facts About Prescription Drug Abuse

Myth: Prescription drugs come from a doctor and a pharmacy, so they must be safe.
Reality: If they are not taken responsibly and exactly as the doctor intended, prescription medicines can land you in the emergency room—or the morgue.

Myth: It's OK for me to use a prescription from the previous patient that was prescribed for someone in my family.
Reality: Just because a medication has been prescribed doesn't mean it is appropriate and safe for everyone. Many prescribed medicines are customized to the patient's medical history, weight, allergies, etc. Bottom line: Never take anyone else's prescriptions. It's not only unsafe—it's illegal.

Myth: Using prescription drugs is legal.
Reality: There are both federal and state laws that make using and sharing prescription drugs against the law. If you take a pill that was prescribed to someone else or give that pill to another person, it is not only harmful, it is illegal.

Myth: If I only use drugs "once in a while," I can't have an overdose or get addicted. Addiction is something that takes a really long time.
Reality: Drugs affect different people in different ways, and some people can experience dangerous side effects or even a fatal reaction the first time they take a drug. Even when you have a prescription for the drug, you can have an adverse reaction if not taking it as directed. Addiction can occur very quickly. For example, Percocet addiction can occur in as little as 3 weeks. Teens can become addicted to substances more quickly than adults. (Information courtesy of the National Institute of Drug Abuse)

Don't Be Fooled

Spice...

Spice is a synthetic cannabinoid, a type of marijuana...
Consequences of synthetic cannabinoid abuse, but Spice, teens have been reported to develop serious addiction in a controlled environment, making the drugs they never know for certain the chemical makeup, every chemical component present in the drug.

Spice was first marketed in Korea, since 2007. The U.S. Drug Administration has placed Spice in Schedule I status under the Controlled Substances Act. Spice is considered to have a high potential for abuse, to possess or sell products that contain the drug, and to possess or sell products that contain the drug. Their personnel from possessing or using Spice.

Spice is highly addictive. Users of Spice are more likely to become addicted to synthetic cannabinoids are more addictive than marijuana, which is actually about five times more addictive than marijuana.

Current Concern - Spice (K2)



- A mixture of herbs & chemicals sold as incense or potpourri
- JWH-018 – a cannabinoid agonist - created in a lab by a Clemson University professor to mimic the THC in mj for drug studies
- Sold with the labeling “not for human consumption”
- A lot of variation in the products – raises risk of accidental overdose
- Banned by all military branches. Banned in Korea.
- Effects: mimics mj “high” often more intense/quickly, may induce hallucinations, seizures, elevated heart rate, severe agitation, and vomiting.



Why Do We Do What We Do?



- Adolescence is, in fact, *the* critical period for the onset of substance use and its potentially debilitating consequences. Most adult substance problems started during the teen years.
- There has been a boom in research on the developing teen brain. Researchers believe that alcohol and drugs may be more reinforcing to the developing brain and thus, more subject to “hijack” the brain.
- Teaching skills in self-regulation (impulse control) has been identified as a critical component of effective prevention efforts.

 - Unmarried dependent children under 23

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Area II CPAC



- **Definition of Military Spouse**

- Spouse of Active Duty Service Member
- Spouse must be married PRIOR to sponsor's arrival to the overseas assignment.
- Does not have to be on sponsor's orders

- **Applicability of Military Spouse Preference (MSP)**

- May use only once per PCS move
- Applies to all permanent NAF and AF positions
- Temporary positions lasting more than 1 year
- Does not override VRA and 30% DAV eligible veterans
- Spouses transported at own or sponsor's expense are eligible for Military Spouse Preference
- Must be among the “best qualified” group and within reach for selection
- Declination of job offer eliminates preference until next PCS

USFK Force Protection Advisory for Nuclear Security Summit (NSS) (21-28 March 2012)

FP Advisory #12-01

1. USFK is publishing this force protection advisory to provide situational awareness to all DoD personnel regarding the NSS to be held at the COEX complex 26-27 Mar 2012. The NSS will take place at the Convention and Exhibition Center (COEX) located in the heart of the busy Gangnam district of southern Seoul. The NSS is a forum to enhance international cooperation to prevent nuclear proliferation. Heads of State and Ministers from 58 nations, along with senior officials from the United Nations, Interpol, International Atomic Energy Agency and the European Union will also attend. The summit will consist of three meetings including the Experts Meeting on 22 March at the Grand Hilton Hotel; Industries Meeting on 23-24 March at the Grand Intercontinental Hotel; and the NSS at the COEX on 26-27 March. Additionally, the heads of state will be staying at various hotels within the Greater Seoul Metropolitan Area. The NSS cooperates with various international organizations, and develops potential complex issues that have a tendency to draw pro and anti NSS demonstrators. This fact, coupled with the stature and positions of the attendees and the global concern regarding nuclear security will ensure worldwide media coverage for this event.

2. From 21-28 March 2012, exact times not specified, combined civilian groups may hold anti-U.S. and ROK civil demonstrations that could have the potential to become violent. The locations of these civil gatherings will take place in Seoul and around the COEX complex. Due to unexpected road closures and the potential for demonstrations, expect delays on all roads, bus/subway lines and airports.
3. Due to the potential for violence, the following mitigation measures are being put into place:
 - a. COEX complex is off limits to all USFK members unless in authorized official capacity.
 - b. The 600 meter radius of the COEX is off limits to all USFK members except those residing within the radius.
 - c. (22-27 March 2012) Road Conditions in Seoul will be AMBER (Military vehicles, other than those required for essential business, will not be driven on highways. POV owners need to use extreme caution and are encouraged to observe the rules established for military vehicles.
 - d. (22-27 March 2012) For Area II, military uniforms will not be worn off Military Installations with the exception of to and from duty.
 - e. Strongly recommend members of USFK limit all travel to and within Seoul
 - f. NLT 1 March 2012, components revalidate notification systems of members in respective commands and report compliance back to USFK J3 through CC Seoul at DSN 723-3030 / 3024 NIPR: ccseoul@korea.army.mil.
4. Within the Greater Seoul Metropolitan Area, expect delays on all roads, bus/subway lines and airports. The Korean government will provide enhanced security and robust traffic control for the COEX complex along all routes members of the NSS will travel to get to and from the 12 Hotels and three venues they will use in Seoul. Travel restrictions to and within Seoul could rapidly increase for USFK members. The Korean National Police encourage the use of the subway to avoid potential of unexpected road closures.

5. U.S. personnel are advised to avoid all areas where any civil demonstrators are gathered. If a USFK member sees a demonstration “STAY AWAY” and immediately report the location to the USFK MP Desk at 050-738-6374/8070. As always, USFK personnel should also be aware of their surroundings and avoid encounters with event participants in order to prevent media attention and ensure personal safety.
6. The advisory applies to DoD civilian employees, USFK invited and technical representatives, and all USFK family and service members.
