
### **CONGRATULATIONS to:**

#### Love and Logic – Word of Caution

Many of you have taken the Parenting with Love and Logic course, written by Jim Fay and Foster Cline, which has been offered at this base for years. In fact, it was so popular at one point we had to put a limit on how many could attend. Some people even took it three times! If you took the course, hopefully over the years, all the ideas and language patterns have become part of your parenting style and you have managed to raise responsible children who have learned from logical consequences with a loving parent nearby for support. Some of you may have children who have resisted this love and logic approach and continue to make choices that aren't really working for them. For example, you might have a child who is about two to three years older than they were when you took the course. They may have become so adept at learning to live with their bad choices that it doesn't faze them at all – or so it seems. Here is where the *caution* comes in.

Don't let that fool you. Being a Love and Logic parent doesn't mean you can stop being a parent. When your child continues to make bad choices, you must step in. That is what parenting is all about. Don't forget – your child needs parents who are not "**drill sergeants**' or '**helicopters**' but are '**consultants**'. If this doesn't ring a bell, get out your old workbook! If your child is failing a class it is still your job as a parent to help them see the errors of their way.

I imagine some of you don't know what I'm talking about because you haven't taken the course. If this is the case, please sign up for the next Becoming a Love and Logic Parent class that is going to be offered starting in January. It starts Tuesday, January 10<sup>th</sup>, and runs for 6 sessions. Remember, you can offer choices for your child, but they must be ones you can live with.
