DEFENSE TRAVEL SERVICE – A BETTER WAY TO TRAVEL!

What is DTS?

- The DTS program is similar to choosing a flight through online commercial travel services.
- Reservists will be able to select their desired seating arrangement, choose eligible flights and may also enter their personal frequent flyer information to receive credit for the flight.
- Reservists may also book cars and hotels through DTS.

What else can DTS do?

- The DTS also processes travel claims easier than before. Reservists will be able to document their expenses on an electronic voucher in DTS.
- They will then be able to either upload scanned receipts or fax those to a computer that will scan and attach them to the voucher.
- The Reservist being reimbursed within a target time of 72 hours.
- This quicker repayment of funds may lead to a greater willingness to travel in support of Navy missions.

Will DTS replace NROWS?

- No. DTS will only help arrange travel and facilitate travel vouchers.
- Reservists will still request orders through NROWS.

Why is DTS being used?

 The use of DTS by all military personnel and DOD civilian personnel has been mandated by DOD.

When can we expect to see DTS?

 It is currently being rolled out in the Northwest, with estimated completion by 31 JUL. We expect it to roll out in the following regions: Midwest by 31 SEP; Midlant by 31 DEC; Southeast by 28 FEB; and Southwest by 30 APR.

How will I learn to use DTS?

 There will be numerous Train the Trainer" classes in each region, which will focus on training the FTS order writers and squadron administrative personnel. In turn, they will be responsible for training their Sailors.
