- The Haiti earthquake disaster showed how Navy Reserve on-demand expertise enhances the Navy to accomplish its mission.
- Within hours, every Navy Reserve C-40, C-9 and C-130 squadron brought more than a million pounds of food and supplies into Haiti. The Reserve Force also delivered:
 - 50 tons of gear to support the Mobile Diving Salvage Unit rebuilding piers
 - 90 tons of cargo-handling equipment for the Expeditionary Logistics Support Group
 - 50 tons of communication gear for Mobile Ashore Support Terminal unit.
- Navy Reserve Sailors are providing about half the Navy's Individual Augmentees (IAs) serving in Iraq, Afghanistan and other vital areas.
- As the Navy's standard for on-demand expertise, we deliver fill-time excellence through part-time and full-time service.
- Contributions to national security are enabled by policies, processes and administrative systems that are transparent and seamless, making it easier for Sailors and families to serve.
- The Navy Reserve's on-demand expertise is a crucial component of the six core elements of the Maritime Strategy: forward presence, deterrence, sea control, power projection, maritime security and humanitarian assistance/disaster response.

Merchant Marine Reserve *Merchant Marine Individual Ready Reserve Group (MMIRRG)*

- Comprised of MMR SELRES and the MMIRRG
- It is an all Reserve, all Officer community.
- All MMR are required to maintain an unlimited tonnage or unlimited HP, United States Coast Guard-issued, Merchant Marine License.
- The MMIRRG is the only actively managed IRR program in the Navy that is funded and has a mission.
- MISSION: To support strategic sealift both afloat and ashore.
- The MMR Program Manager is CNRFC N14. CNRFC acts as the “Virtual” Unit, NOSC, RCC and OSO for the MMIRRG.
- Primary commissioning sources include the US Merchant Marine Academy, the six state maritime schools, and a MMIRRG Direct Commission Officer program.
- The MMIRRG provides:
 - Harbor Pilots for the port of Ash Shuaybah, Kuwait
 - Full time support to the Sealift Logistic Commands
 - Joint logistics expertise at USTRANSCOM
 - Valuable maritime experience to INTEL units
- MMR SELRES billets include:
 - Merchant Marine Reserve Operational Headquarters Units
 - Expeditionary Port Units
 - Naval Control and Guidance of Shipping Units
 - Navy Expeditionary Logistics Support Group Units
 - NAVINTEL units

- 2,391 are in the MMIRRG
- 92 Hard-coded MMR SELRES Billets
