Foreign Language and Culture Pilot Program

The program allows Reservists, in specific designators and ratings to receive bonuses for completing certain language and culture studies programs at accredited colleges and universities. Eligibility for this program is established by OPNAVINST 1550.11.

Bonuses potentially could be as high as \$5,000 during a fiscal year.

To be eligible for the program enlisted members must have at least 24 months remaining on their service contract at completion of the last approved course. Officers must agree to continue serving as a selected Reservist for 24 continuous months following the end of the last approved course.

A course of study in critical languages and regional areas or cultural disciplines must meet certain criteria to be approved.

The course must be three or more credit hours and completed at an institution of higher learning which is accredited and recognized by the Department of Education.
