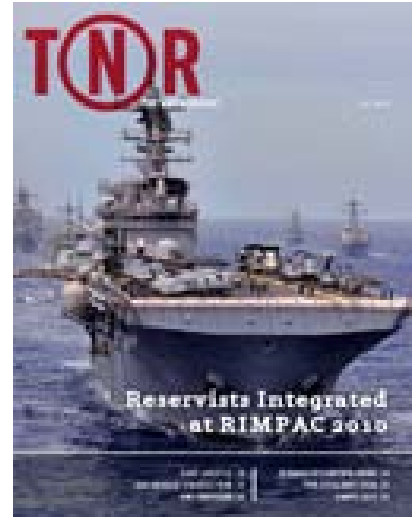
On-Demand Expertise
