Honoring Families Family Readiness

Within our lifelines we provide support to our Sailors, individually and proactively. We stand ready to assist service members' families, whenever and wherever they need our help. We recognize, respect, and honor the civilian employers whose support enables our Navy Reservists to serve our Navy and our Nation. We honor their service by both our actions and words.

The nature of service is of course sacrifice, and Reserve Sailors have sacrificed greatly and it would not be possible without the on-going support of family and friends on the homefront. We appreciate the sacrifices Sailors and family members make every day.

One way we honor and support our families is by conducting pre-deployment family readiness conferences. Reserve Sailors and their families are informed about support services offered to assist them before, during, and after a deployment.

The deployment process can be challenging for service members and families, alike. The pre-deployment conferences focus on legal and financial counseling, as well as emotional health and welfare.

The primary purpose of the conferences is ensure the Sailors and families are ready for deployment. Deployment is stressful, but they are not alone if they need help. Conferences are an opportunity to expose the family to information and resources.

Topics normally covered include legal affairs, employer support, health care, operational security, career counseling, education and the Fleet and Family Support Program.

Every week, Navy Reserve Sailors and their families are preparing for some type of duty, be it ADT, ADSW or mobilization in support of Overseas Contingency Operations – in fact, approximately 17,000 of our 65,000 Reserve Component Sailors are on orders!
