Port of New Orleans Director Gary Lagrange requested MARAD's assistance through Federal Emergency Management Administration to provide vessels for berthing to accommodate approximately 3,000 personnel who were anticipated to return to the area to open the Port of New Orleans. Vessels with the optimum berthing capacity included MARAD school ships.

MARAD notified general agents to commence the activation and preparation for sail.

The U.S. Maritime Administration (MARAD) activated ten ships from the RRF to aid the area's recovery by helping to rebuild the infrastructure and three state maritime academy training ships to house over 1,000 relief workers with skills and abilities critical to vital recover efforts.
