USDA/DOE Biomass Program Technical Advisory Committee June 3, 2009

- Expedite the implementation of BCAP (Biomass Crop Assistance Program) within USDA Farm Service Agency.
- Indirect Land Use Limited to no scientific basis for evaluation. Limit the evaluation to areas where there is a direct correlation.

 With existing research programs, we recommend a carbon assessment and environmental assessment be a part of the program. Many projects already do this.

- Woody biomass is limited by the lack of long-term supply contracts on federal lands. Federal government should address this.
- The Regional Feedstock Partnerships (RFP) should be used to develop information on yield, sustainability, social issues, etc. of scale-up biomass feedstock production.

 Additional techno-economic information is needed to help in the identification and selection of appropriate systems that might be used to harvest, consolidate and convert invasive species to biofuels or biopower.

 We recommend that DOE/USDA develop a comprehensive listing of all funding opportunities (ie, grants, loans guarantees, producer payments) and make this list available to biomass researchers, producers and technology providers.

 We recommend that the government conduct an economic impact study on production and conversion of biomass feedstocks to local economies.
