Active Solicitations



Advanced Biofuels

- Integrated Pilot-Scale or Demonstration-Scale Biorefinery for Advanced Biofuels
 - Up to \$480M over 5 years for up to 20 projects
 - Pilot-Scale requires <u>></u>20% cost share
 - Demo-scale requires > 50% cost share
 - Closed; Proposal review completed



Active Solicitations Continued



Ethanol Blends Infrastructure & Outreach

- Refueling Infrastructure for Higher Ethanol Blends
 - \$3.5M for 15 30 projects
 - Expand the infrastructure at retail fueling locations to accommodate blends up to E85
- Outreach for higher ethanol blends
 - \$2M for up to 5 projects
 - National campaign projects that will raise public awareness of the benefits, safety, and use requirements of higher ethanol blends up to E85
- Closed; Proposal review is underway

Algal and Advanced Biofuels

- Development of algae-based biofuels and advanced, infrecompatible biofuels
- Up to \$85M for 2 3 partnership-based projects over 3 years
- Closed; Proposals are currently undergoing technical merit and programmatic review
- Anticipate an announcement in Winter 2010

Awards Made



- DOE selected 3 projects under the 2009 USDA/DOE joint solicitation:
 - Exelus, Inc. (Livingston, NJ) up to \$1,200,000
 - Consortium for Research on Renewable Industrial Materials (Washington, Idaho, North Carolina, Mississippi, and Tennessee) up to \$1,430,535
 - The University of Tennessee (Knoxville,TN) up to \$2,345,290
