Farm Bill Energy Title, Section 9003 Biorefinery Assistance

- Provides grants for demonstration scale and loan guarantees for commercial scale Biorefineries that produce Advanced Biofuel
- Guaranteed Loan Limitations: Up to \$250 Million for Biorefineries
- Grant Limitations: Pilot/Demonstration Scale – Up to 50% of project costs
- Mandatory Funding: FY 2009 - \$75 Million FY 2010 - \$245 Million available until expended



Farm Bill Energy Title, Section 9004, Repowering Assistance

- Purpose:
 - Payments to replace fossil fuel used to produce heat or power to operate existing biorefineries
- Mandatory Funding:
 FY 09 \$35 Million available until expended



Farm Bill Energy Title, Section 9005 Bioenergy Program for Advanced Biofuels

• Purpose:

Payments to eligible producers to support and ensure expanded production of Advanced Biofuels



Farm Bill Energy Title, Section 9005 Bioenergy Program for Advanced Biofuels

- Mandatory Funding:
 - A). \$55,000,000 FY 2009B). \$55,000,000 FY 2010
 - **D**). 333,000,000 FI 2010
 - C). \$85,000,000 FY 2011
 - D). \$105,000,000 FY 2012
- Discretionary Funding Availability of \$25,000,000 each FY 2009-2012



Farm Bill Energy Title, Section 9007 Rural Energy for America Program

- Loan Guarantee Limits:

- * \$25 Million Cap
- * Cap Federal share at 75% of project costs

- Mandatory Funding:

- * FY 09 \$55 Million
- * FY 10 \$60 Million
- * FY 11 \$70 Million
- * FY 12 \$70 Million
- Discretionary Funding Available : \$25 Million each fiscal year for FY 09 - 12



Farm Bill Energy Title, Section 9007 (Con't)

Formerly Section 9006 – Renewable Energy Systems and Energy Efficiency Improvements Program – Section 9007, Rural Energy for America Program.

Establishes a grant and loan guarantee program to assist agriculture producers and rural small businesses in purchasing renewable energy systems and making energy efficiency improvements.

Establishes a Grant Program for energy audits, technical assistance and feasibility studies.

Farm Bill Energy Title, Section 9008

• Purpose:

Support of research, development and demonstration on biobased products, biofuels, and biopower.

Eligible Recipients:

 Institutions of Higher Learning; National
 Laboratory; Federal Research Agency; State
 Research Agency; Private Sector Entities and
 Nonprofit Organizations or a consortium of two or
 more of entities described above.



Farm Bill Energy Title, Section 9008,

Mandatory Funding:

- FY 09 \$20 Million
- FY 10 \$28 Million
- FY 11 \$30 Million
- FY 12 \$40 Million
- Discretionary Funding: FY 09 12 \$35 Million per Fiscal Year



Farm Bill Energy Title, Section 9011 Biomass Crop Assistance Program

- Program Supports Payments for:

- * Establishment and Production of renewable biomass crops for conversion to bioenergy
- * Collection, harvest, storage, and transportation of biomass crops for use in biomass conversion facilities

 Mandatory Funding available in amount necessary for FY 08 - 12
