General Description of Your Program Activities undertaken by Students/Residents in Program	CHCACT will implement a SEARCH program in Connecticut that places a total of 23 students and 16 residents at the thirteen (13) FQHCs in the state over the three year program period. Students and Residents for the SEARCH program will be selected via application for the limited number of slots each year. Preceptors and Mentors will receive training and support to perform their critical roles in the CT SEARCH program. Finally, CHCACT will bring together the SEARCH Partner Network to provide assistance and guidance in implementing a successful SEARCH program. The Network will include representatives from the academic partners in CT, the CT Primary Care Office, State Office of Rural Health and the Connecticut Area Health Education Center. Students/Residents will be matched with FQHCs that have successfully completed a Community Assessment Tool to ensure their appropriateness as placement sites. Further, they will be matched with preceptors and mentors who will be identified, trained and supported to provide strong and consistent guidance to students and
	residents. Student interns will choose from among three clinical project areas selected annually that align with academic needs of the student, community needs of the FQHC and quality reporting guidelines of HRSA. Residents will participate in clinical rotations led by a multidisciplinary team of preceptors.

	At the State level, students and residents will be supported by the SEARCH Partner Network. The Network will meet monthly to address and advise CHCACT on key implementation issues such as preceptor and mentor selection, student and resident selection, clinical training focus for placements, expanding the network to other academic and community partners, and project evaluation.
Coordination	SEARCH students will complete 6 week summer internships. Each student will be matched with an FQHC preceptor and a mentor. They will choose from three possible project areas to focus their internship. The internship will include 2 days per week of clinical rotation at an FQHC, 2 days per week of project work conducted as appropriate the FQHC or CHCACT, and 1 day of professional development with expert faculty presentation.
	SEARCH medical residents will complete a 50-day, one year residency rotation at an FQHC. Each resident will be matched with three FQHC preceptors from internal medicine, family medicine and pediatrics to provide a multidisciplinary experience.
