TEAM TRAVIS GOLDEN BEAR

TEAM TRAVIS HONORARY COMMANDERS

Travis Air Force Base has an exciting program designed to foster support between the base and local communities. The Honorary Commanders' Program was developed to encourage an exchange of ideas, experiences, and friendship between key members of the local civilian community and the Travis military community. The program provides a unique opportunity for members of Solano communities to shadow commanders of groups, squadrons and tenant units at Travis to understand and then share these experiences with the larger community in businesses and the organizations in which they are involved.

TRAVIS COMMUNITY CONSORTIUM

The Travis Community Consortium works to bolster public awareness of Travis Air Force Base's strategic military value. The TCC is the culmination of a 15- to 20-year quest to improve base facilities and missions. The dramatic makeover of the base is due to local business, civic and elected officials working with elected representatives in Washington D.C., to receive funding for military construction projects. The TCC is comprised of Solano County, its seven cities, the Economic Development Corporation, Solano Community College and the Travis Regional Armed Forces Committee. Each year, TCC representatives advocate on behalf of Travis AFB at Air Mobility Command and the Secretary of the Air Force.

TRAVIS REGIONAL ARMED FORCES COMMITTEE

The Travis Regional Armed Forces Committee is a local community organization that supports the men, women and missions of Travis Air Force Base. Its membership is comprised of over 150 local business and civic leaders, including elected officials from throughout Solano County, the state and federal government. The organization meets monthly at the Delta Breeze Club, where the group receives updates on Travis activities from the base's leaders. Throughout the year, TRAFIC hosts events honoring the men and women Travis. Periodically, the organization's members visit congressional leaders in the nation's capital to seek support for military construction projects, military benefits, equipment improvements and additional missions. The organization also leads efforts to achieve necessary support from local governments, agencies and businesses on matters crucial to the base and its operations. In short, TRAFIC is the community's eyes, ears and voice for the people of Team Travis.

TRAFIC is also proud to offer the Military Medallion Program as a visible and tangible way for members of TRAFIC and local chambers to show their support for the military.
