SUBJECT: Dissemination of the publication entitled: "Achieving Employment

Outcomes Through VR Counselors Who Meet the Comprehensive System

of Personnel Development (CSPD) Requirements," developed by the

Twenty-Fifth Institute on Rehabilitation Issues (IRI).

CONTENT: The purpose of this Information Memorandum (IM) is to transmit the

enclosed publication to vocational rehabilitation (VR) professionals, rehabilitation counselor training personnel, advocates and other interested persons. The publication was developed in partnership with individuals

representing various State VR programs, the Regional Rehabilitation Continuing Education Programs (RRCEP), rehabilitation counselor training personnel, and the Rehabilitation Services Administration (RSA).

Education Program VI at the University of Arkansas, served as the university coordinator for the study group. Ms. Jeanne Munro served as

the Chairperson.

We recommend that the IRI publication be brought to the attention of staff responsible for developing and maintaining the State VR agency's personnel system. The document provides guidance that can be used in creating a dynamic system of continuous quality improvement that

supports the hiring of qualified staff and the continuing education of VR agency personnel.

It is also important that higher education institutions responsible for training rehabilitation counselors use this document to better understand and respond to the requirements of the CSPD. Finally, members of the State Rehabilitation Councils and advocates for people with disabilities may wish to become familiar with the content of this document in order to fulfill their respective roles in providing advice and consultation to State VR agency management.

The *IRI* publications are widely used by VR counselors and supervisors, human resource development specialists, community-based rehabilitation service providers, administrators, researchers, educators and policy analysts in fulfilling the purposes of the Rehabilitation Act, as amended, particularly, "... to empower individuals with disabilities to maximize employment, economic self-sufficiency, independence, and inclusion and integration into society...".

An important part of RSA's mission is to provide training and technical assistance to State VR agencies on the problems facing rehabilitation service providers, and to disseminate and promote the utilization of knowledge resulting from current research. Through the *IRI*, high priority training needs are responded to expeditiously, and the study findings on a specific topic are quickly transposed into useful and usable training materials and publications.

Improving the skills of personnel in the Public VR program through effective training is a basic function of RSA's RRCEPs. RSA funds the following three RSA RRCEPs to serve as prime study group coordinators for developing the three publications: the University of Arkansas; George Washington University; and, the University of Wisconsin-Stout.
