**SUBJECT:** Discontinuation of Data Collection on Post Employment Services and Annual Reviews using Form RSA-62, OMB Number: 1820-0014

## POLICY STATEMEN

**STATEMENT:** The Form RSA-62 collected information on post-employment services, annual reviews of ineligibility determinations, and annual reviews of employment in settings that did not meet the criteria for competitive employment. The Rehabilitation Act Amendments of 1998 made substantial changes to the requirements for annual reviews and corresponding data collection. Because of these changes and underutilization of previously collected information, RSA has determined that it is no longer necessary to continue data collection on annual reviews. We will be evaluating other methods to collect information on post-employment services.

Under the Paperwork Reduction Act of 1995, therefore, we have discontinued Form RSA-62 as an approved data collection instrument. Since the form transmitted to you under RSA-PD-95-05, dated June 22, 1995, expired on May 31, 1998 (eight months into FY 1998), some State agencies voluntarily submitted information for FY 1998.

Beginning October 1, 1998 (FY 1999), agencies will no longer be required to collect information for or submit Form RSA-62.
