

# MCH TRAINING PROGRAM: MCH PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT GRANTS

#### Mission

In addition to supporting graduate training of maternal and child health (MCH) professionals, the Maternal and Child Health Bureau (MCHB) is committed to advancing the knowledge and skills of practicing MCH professionals. MCHB funds programs specifically focused on continuing education, including Collaborative Office Rounds (COR), Distance Learning (DL)programs, Knowledge to Practice (KP) and the MCH Leadership Skills Training Institute. MCH Professional Development grants address new and emerging issues in the field, using in person, distance-based, and blended (some in person and some distance) methods.

## Purpose

- **COR** supports small discussion groups that meet at regular intervals over sustained periods of time to address the mental health aspects of pediatric care. The groups are jointly led by pediatricians and child psychiatrists, and participants include practitioners, fellows, and residents. Although they vary in a number of ways, all groups aim to improve the ability of primary care providers to address the day-to-day psychosocial issues of children, adolescents, and their families.
- **DL** grants provide effective and efficient means by which maternal and child health (MCH) professionals can enhance and advance their analytical, managerial, administrative, and clinical skills while continuing to meet their daily on-site responsibilities. Projects provide continuing education on diverse MCH topics to a regional and/or national audience.
- KP grants increase the leadership skills of MCH professionals by facilitating the timely transfer of new information, research findings, and technology related to MCH; and updating and improving the knowledge and skills of health and related professionals in programs serving mothers and children. These programs support the conduct of short-term, non-degree related courses, symposia, institutes, and distance learning strategies and/or development of curricula, guidelines, standards of practice, and educational tools/strategies intended to assure quality health care for the MCH population.
- MCH Certificate Programs enhance the skills of the existing public health workforce by using innovative strategies to address the special educational needs of health professionals who live in isolated geographic communities or are from underserved or underrepresented populations.
- MCH Leadership Skills Training Institute offers continuing education and training to increase leadership skills for key management personnel in state Title V MCH programs in the United States. These institutes integrate content material from both MCH and children with special health care needs programs and address leadership skills topics.

## Program Profiles

- COR: In FY2009, MCHB funded 10 programs with total annual awards totaling \$150,000. The grant awards are \$15,000 per year. The next grant competition for COR is FY2011.
- **DL**: In FY2009, MCHB funded 6 programs at \$100,000 each. The next grant competition for Distance Learning is FY2010.



- **KP**: In FY2009, MCHB funded 6 programs, with total annual awards amounting to \$180,000. The grant awards are \$30,000 per year. The next grant competition is FY2010.
- MCH Certificate: In FY2009, MCHB funded 2 programs at \$180,000 per year. The next grant competition is FY2014.
- MCH Leadership Skills Institute: In FY2009, MCHB funded 1 program at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, with an annual award of \$265,000 in the first year and \$360,000 in subsequent years. The next grant competition is FY2014.
