# Mission and Vision

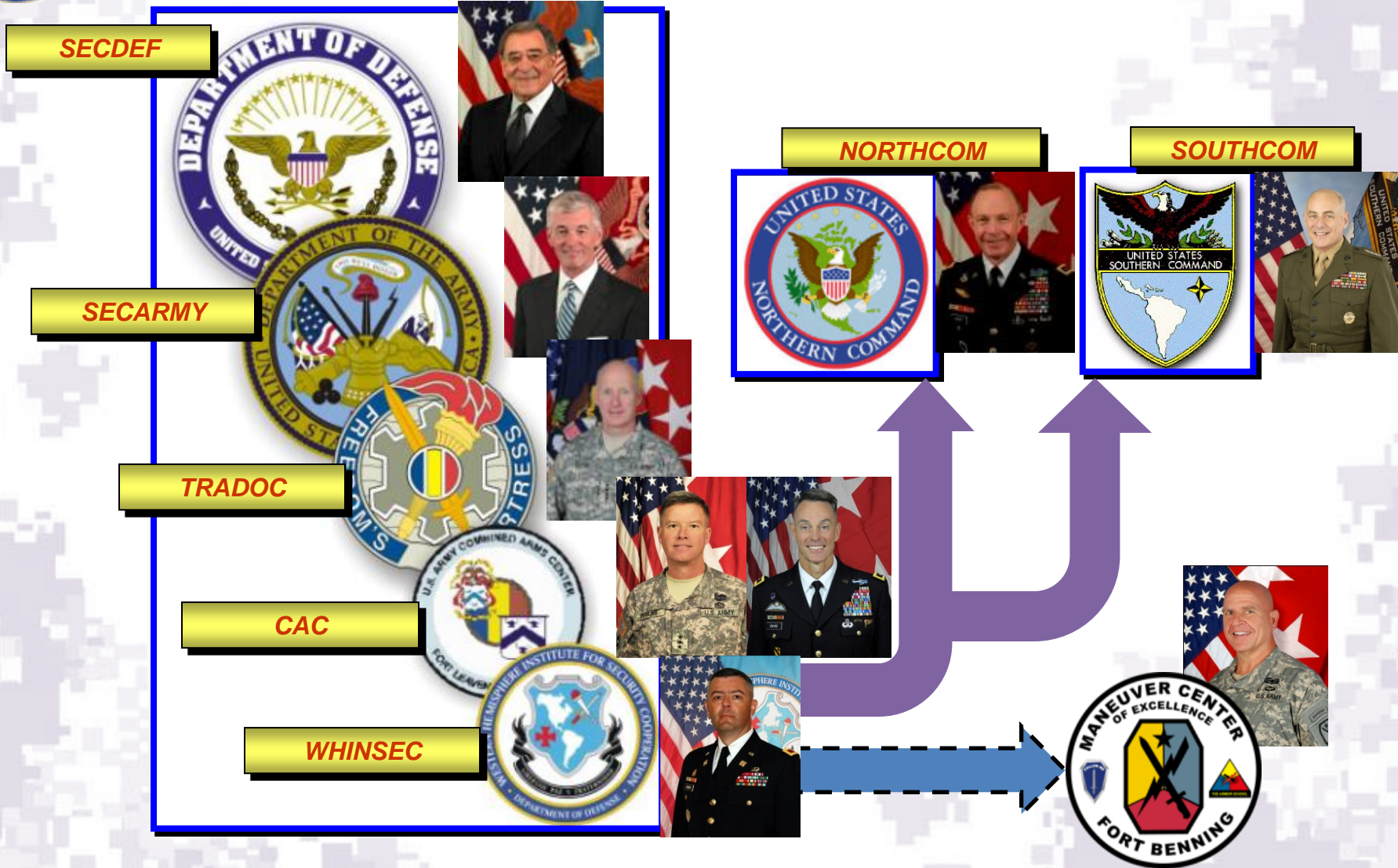
## Mission

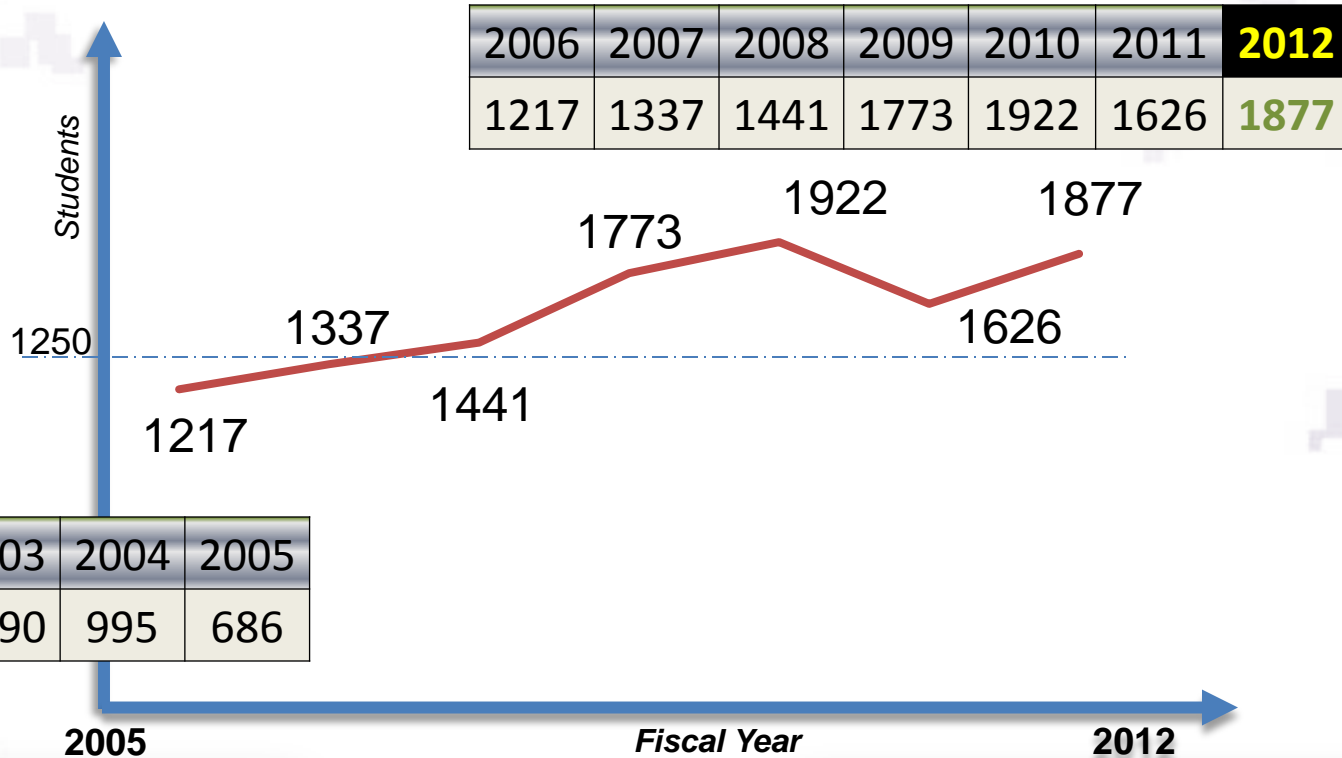

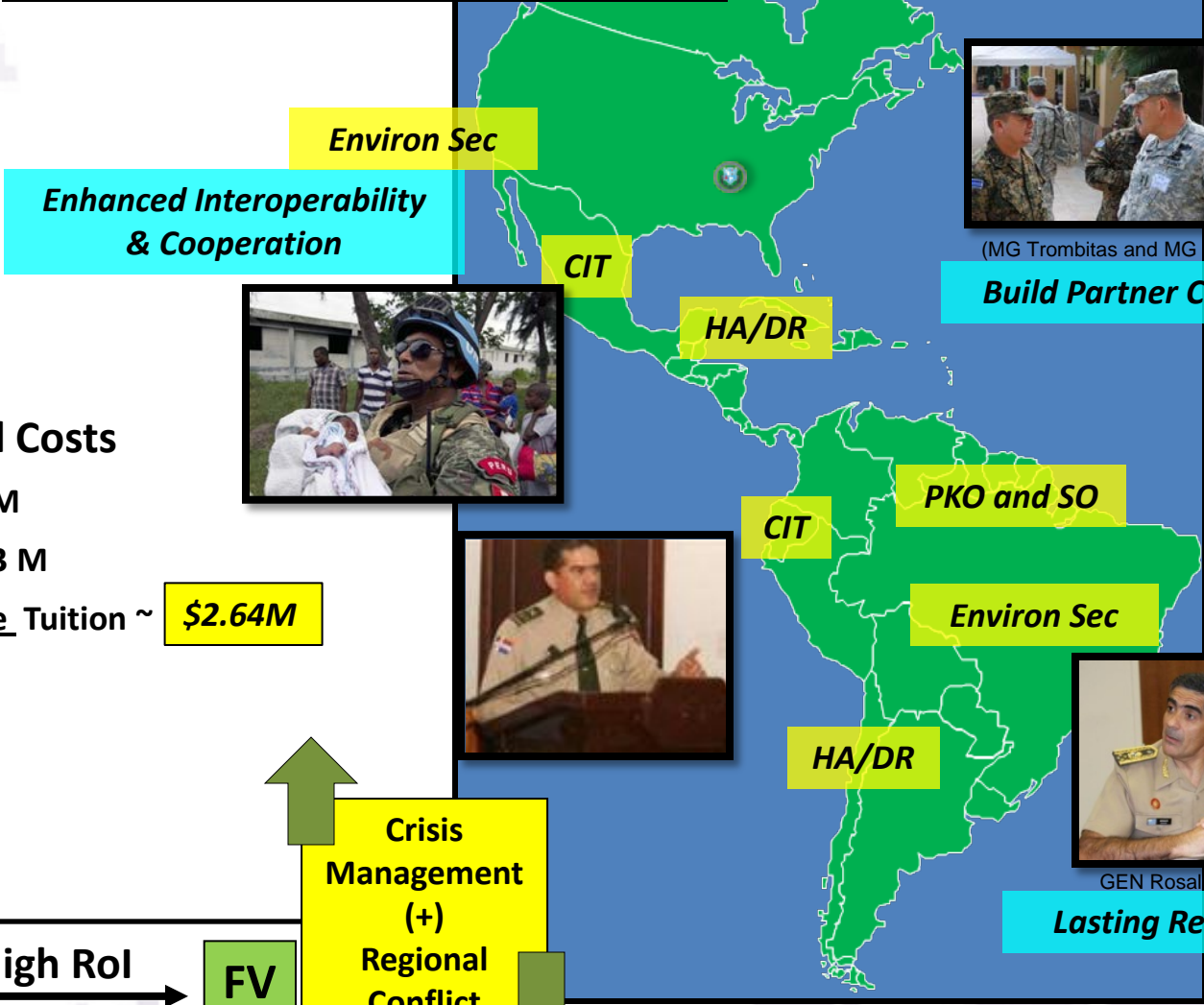

Phase I: Buildings 323 & 397 Move-In, November 2012



On November 28, the first elements of WHINSEC's staff and faculty began moving into WHINSEC's new facility on Baltzell Ave., Fort Benning.

WHINSEC's Library, Staff & Faculty Development and Translation Divisions are now in full operation in building 323.

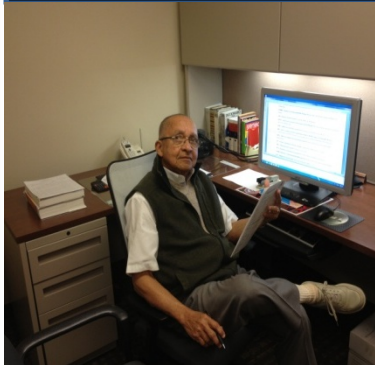
Bldg 397 is prepared for installation of the Engagement Skills Trainer (EST), which will provide valuable interactive training to students in the appropriate use of force.

Approximately 40 WHINSEC employees are now working at the future facility.

- Nov 12 Phase I – Occupy 323 (SFDD, Translation, Library) & 397 (EST)
- Feb 13 Phase II – Occupy 316 (Auditorium, Large Classroom)
- Jul - Sep 13 Phase III – Occupy 322 (Staff Offices) & 396 (HQ, 16 Classrooms)
- Jan - Oct 14 Phase IV – Occupy 241 (SPME, EDTECH, DOL, Classrooms) & 324 (School of Specialized Studies)
