Mission


- Provide professional education and training to military, law enforcement, and civilian personnel of the Western Hemisphere within the context of the democratic principles of the Organization of the American States (OAS).



Field Studies Program: GOAL





Phase I: Buildings 323 & 397 Move-In, November 2012



On November 28, the first elements of WHINSEC's staff and faculty began moving into WHINSEC's new facility on Baltzell Ave., Fort Benning.





Bldg 397 is prepared for installation of the Engagement Skills Trainer (EST). which will provide valuable interactive training to students in the appropriate use of force.

Approximately 40 WHINSEC employees are now working at the future facility.
