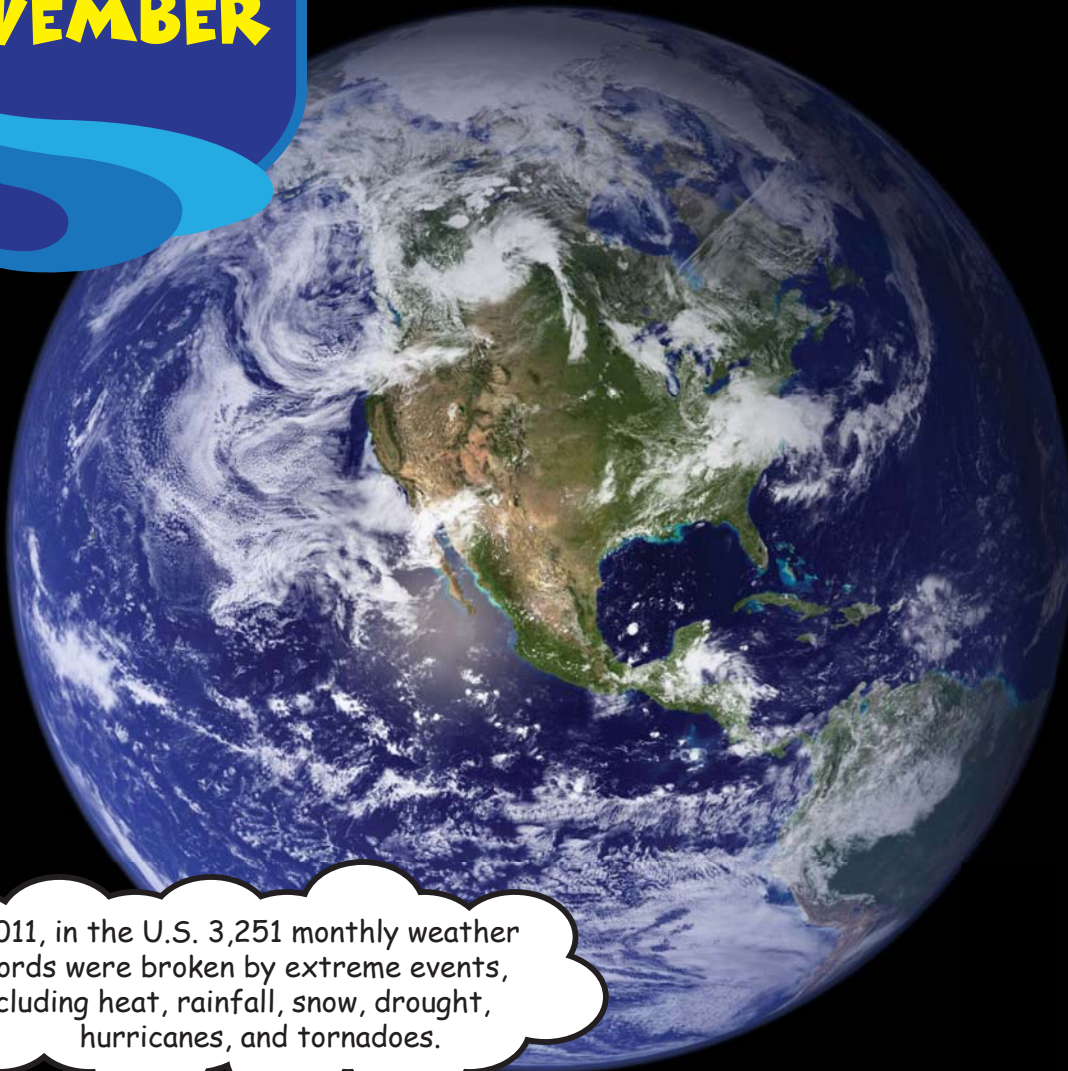


# NOVEMBER

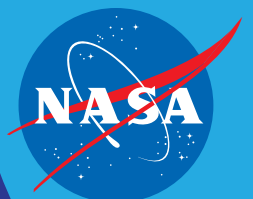


In 2011, in the U.S. 3,251 monthly weather records were broken by extreme events, including heat, rainfall, snow, drought, hurricanes, and tornadoes.

				2003: The solar "Halloween Storms" cause high radiation levels, damaging satellites, threatening ISS astronauts, and rerouting planes away from the North Pole. <b>1</b>	<b>2</b>	<b>3</b>
<b>4</b>	1967: Launch of ATS-3 geostationary satellite, the first to provide color images of Earth. Finally decommissioned in 2001! <b>5</b>	<b>6</b>	1940: "Galloping Gertie" Bridge in Tacoma, WA, collapses in 42-mph winds, the exact speed to create a destructive vibration in its structure. <b>7</b>	1953: Residents of New York City suffered through 10 days of smog, resulting in 200 deaths. <b>8</b>	1926: The La Plata Killer Tornado in Maryland kills 17 and demolishes buildings. Chickens are found defeathered. <b>9</b>	<b>10</b>
1911: Janesville, WI, hit by a huge tornado, killing nine; less than an hour later, survivors are digging out of snow and shivering in a blizzard. <b>11</b>	<b>12</b>	1946: Vincent Joseph Schaefer dumps dry ice pellets from an airplane into a cloud to make the first artificially induced snowstorm. <b>13</b>	<b>14</b>	<b>15</b>	<b>16</b>	2011: Fairbanks, AK, high temperature reaches only -30°F, a record low high for this date. <b>17</b>
1421: An intense storm destroys coastal dikes in the Netherlands, sweeping away 72 villages and killing about 10,000 people. <b>18</b>	<b>19</b>	<b>20</b>	<b>21</b>	<b>22</b>	<b>23</b>	<b>24</b>
