This year, we increased our number of Veterans served by 4.8% and since 2003 we have enrolled 26,135 veterans from Iraq and Afghanistan. We continue to focus on quality, customer service, and continuous improvement.

This year, we have seen some notable accomplishments such as our very successful Joint Commission site visit in October, our opening of the beautiful new Oceanside Clinic in July, expansion of our programs for homeless Veterans, and the implementation of the Virtual Lifetime Medical Record.

The Joint Commission conducted an unannounced site visit the week of October 18-22. The team evaluated the Hospital, Home Care, Long Term Care, and Behavioral Health programs. The team was very complimentary about the quality of care. The final report is expected in early 2011.



PATIENT-CENTERED CARE

• Spirit of Planetree Awards VASDHS received two Spirit of Planetree Awards in September 2010. The awards were in the categories of Architectural and Interior Design-Small Projects for our Healing Garden; and Complementary Therapies for the Mantram Repetition program.



Planetree presents 12 Spirit of Planetree Awards annually based on applications from more than 150 affiliates and 540 sites internationally.

HOMELESS VETERAN PROGRAM

VASDHS has made significant progress this year in expanding the Homeless Veteran Program and outreach for homeless Veterans in San Diego County including:

- Receipt of a five-year, \$34 million funding award for a 40-bed Homeless Veteran Domiciliary that will provide homeless Veteran housing for prevention and treatment of homelessness.
- Launching the first U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) and Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Veterans Homelessness Prevention Demonstration Program, which provides short-term funding for housing, utilities, etc.
- Collaboration with San Diego community partners including prosecutors, public defenders, and police to develop the Veterans Justice Outreach Initiative. Two VASDHS staff interfaced with the courts and jails to develop the program.

COMMUNICATIONS & OUTREACH

• Web & Social Media: To improve communications, access and visibility. we continue to enhance our Internet site. We also launched Twitter and Facebook sites this year.



• Outreach: We conduct extensive outreach to Veterans to ensure they are aware of their health care benefits. Outreach includes teaching Transition Assistance Program (TAP) classes for separating military, providing information at Transition Initiative events, and attending community benefits, career fairs and outreach events for Veterans. This year our number of enrolled Veterans grew by 4.8%.

CLINICAL PERFORMANCE MEASURES

For fiscal year 2010, VASDHS met or exceeded all nine categories of Veterans Health Administration clinical measures (diabetes, ischemic heart, prevention, behavioral health screening, tobacco

cessation, community acquired pneumonia, heart failure, acute myocardial infarction and Surgical Care Improvement Project).

VIRTUAL LIFETIME ELECTRONIC RECORD (VLER)

The VA San Diego Healthcare System became the first government medical center to exchange real-time patient electronic records data with a private-sector institution. The pilot between VASDHS and Kaiser Permanente in San Diego has now expanded locally and across the nation. Many of our Veterans also receive care in the private sector; as more private hospitals join the Virtual Lifetime Electronic Record program, known as VLER Health, more of our dual-eligibility Veterans will be able to take advantage of the program. The transparency of the medical record will allow our providers to see the complete medical record, potentially improving decisionmaking and patient care. For the Veterans involved, it can also mean an end to the task of requesting and picking up paper copies of records to bring to their next visit to the medical center, because those records would be visible to the provider online.



NATIONAL VETERANS SUMMER SPORTS CLINIC

VASDHS hosted the third national Veterans Summer Sports Clinic the week of September 19-24, with 76 participants and 220 volunteers. The Clinic is a rehabilitation event designed for Veterans who have been injured within the past seven years, mainly Veterans from Iraq and Afghanistan. The events include a variety of sports such as kayaking, surfing, sailing, cycling, and track and field, as well as classes on wellness and readjustment.





GREEN AWARDS

• VASDHS Energy Champion

VASDHS received an Energy Champion award from San Diego Gas & Electric at a ceremony on May 18, 2010. The medical center was one of 11 organizations recognized by the utility for excellent energy efficiency projects. VASDHS saved almost 3M kWh and received \$400,000 in incentive money in 2009.

 City of San Diego Director's Recycling Award winners of 2010 VASDHS was selected as one of the Director's Recycling Award winners in the City of San Diego Environmental Services Department 2010 Waste Reduction and Recycling Program. CONSTRUCTION

Oceanside Clinic

• The new Oceanside Clinic grand opening was held on July 23, 2010 with a large attendance from the Veteran and local communities. The new two-story 65,000 square-foot clinic was designed to provide services for approximately 88,000

outpatient visits per year. In addition to the primary care and mental health services formerly offered at the Vista Clinic, the new clinic offers a wide variety of specialty services.




VA Medical Center

- Completed plans for a 400-space parking structure, a 30,000 square-foot administration building, and complete renovation of the Emergency Department, with all construction starting in 2011.


ALTERNATIVE REVENUE

Profile

The VA San Diego Healthcare System (VASDHS) provides a wide range of inpatient and outpatient health services at the medical center in La Jolla, and at six community clinics located in Chula Vista, Escondido, Imperial Valley, Mission Valley, Mission Gorge, and Oceanside. We provide medical, surgical, mental health, geriatric, spinal cord injury, and advanced rehabilitation services. VASDHS has 232 operating hospital beds, including skilled nursing beds, and operates several regional referral programs including cardiovascular surgery and spinal cord injury.

We are affiliated with the University of California, San Diego School of Medicine and provide training for 1,567 medical interns, residents and fellows, as well as 82 other teaching affiliations for nursing, pharmacy, dental and dietetics. VASDHS has one of the largest research programs in the VA nationally, with a budget of \$52.2 million (FY 2010), 185 principal investigators, and 534 projects.
