

FAR 51.1 Deviation

¹Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) 51.1, Contractor Use of Government Supply Sources, prescribes policies and procedures under which contractors may use Government sources of supply. Previously, contracting officers could only authorize contractors to use Federal Supply Schedule (FSS) sources of supply during the performance of cost-reimbursement contracts and under other limited scenarios when determined to be in the best interest of the Government.

Recently, a deviation to FAR Part 51.1 was approved to expand the authority of contractors to use FSS sources of supply. Specifically, federal Government contracting officers are now authorized to give all contractors' access to the FSS and General Services Administration (GSA) Global Supply Programs when deemed appropriate for the fulfillment of their agency requirements. Please note that the deviation applies to the FSS programs managed by both the Department of Veterans Affairs and GSA. The authority is limited to the following types of orders:

- 1) Placed on a time and materials or labor hour basis;
- 2) For ancillary supplies/services that are in support of the overall order;
- 3) Issued in accordance with the procedures in FAR 8.405-1, Ordering Procedures for supplies, and services not requiring a statement of work:
- 4) Placed by the Federal Government. The authorization is NOT available to state and local governments.

New Competition Requirements

On May 16, 2011, an interim rule became effective in the Federal Register to implement Section 863 of the Duncan Hunter National Defense Authorization Act, which enhances the competition requirements for orders placed against multiple-award contracts, including, but not limited to:

- Federal Supply Schedules (FSS)
- FSS Blanket Purchase Agreements (BPAs)
- Government-Wide Acquisition Contracts (GWACs)

1) What are some of the important changes that affect how orders/BPAs are placed against VA FSS contracts?

- Procedures for ordering supplies and services under FSS contracts (FAR <u>8.405-1</u> and <u>8.405-2</u>) when the order is above the Simplified Acquisition Threshold (SAT) (currently \$150,000) has been revised to require that ordering activities:
 - 1) Receive at least three quotes, as a general matter, that can fulfill the requirement and fairly consider all quotes received.
 - 2) Document the file to explain efforts made to obtain quotes from at least three FSS contractors that can fulfill the requirements if fewer than three quotes were received and e-Buy was not used.
- New competition procedures (FAR 8.405-3) have been established when creating BPAs under FSS contracts and placing orders under the BPAs.
- The contract award synopsis provisions in FAR 5.301 have been amended to require synopsizing FSS orders or BPAs greater than the SAT, which are supported by a limited source justification in accordance with FAR 8.405-6.
- Clarifies that ordering activities may seek a price reduction under FSS contracts at any time and that they shall seek a price reduction when placing an order or establishing a BPA that exceeds the SAT (FAR 8.405-4).

2) How can ordering activities attain quotes in compliance with the new competition requirements?

A major component of this policy change requires "fair notice" to be given to all contract holders offering the required supplies and/or services prior to placing an order or establishing a FSS BPA estimated over the SAT. GSA eBuy meets the standard of providing "fair notice to all contractors" because all vendors offering the required supplies and/or services are able to view the Request for Quote (RFQ). If eBuy is not used and less than three quotes are received from schedule contractors that can fulfill the requirement(s), the contracting officer must document a determination that no additional contractors capable of fulfilling the requirements could be identified despite reasonable efforts to obtain the quotes.

2nd Quarter FY 2011 Sales Due

At this time, all FSS contractors should have reported their 2nd quarter (i.e. January 1, 2011 – March 31, 2011) sales figures in accordance with contract clause 552.238-74, Industrial Funding Fee (IFF) and Sales Reporting. Pursuant to this clause, a FSS contractor is required to submit its quarterly Report of Sales and IFF payment within 60 days of the completion of each quarter. Please note all FSS contractors are required to submit their sales data for the applicable quarter (even if no sales occurred under the contract). In order to avoid confusion and having an IFF payment returned, all sales figures should be reported **BEFORE** an IFF payment is submitted to our office (regardless of how the IFF is remitted).
