MEMORANDUM FOR All U.S. Army Garrison Personnel

SUBJECT: Installation Fund Raisers Policy

1. REFERENCES:

2. PURPOSE: To provide guidance to all U.S. Garrison personnel on the Garrison Commander's Installation Fund Raisers Policy.

3. APPLICABILITY: This policy is applicable to all civilian and military personnel assigned and/or under the operational control of Fort Hood U.S. Army Garrison.

4. POLICY: Fund raising events are allowed on the installation to collect money, goods, or other support for the benefit of others. There are four types of fund-raising activities authorized: Combined Federal Campaign (CFC); Army Emergency relief (AER); Local fund-raising (i.e., On-post Private Organizations, MWR, and limited informal funds), and Religious fund-raising.

5. PROCEDURES.

IMWE-HOD-MW

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a. All local fund-raising must be approved by the Directorate of Family and Morale, Welfare, and Recreation, with the exception of unit events conducted within the unit footprint and Fort Hood National Bank.

b. CFC and AER coordinators are authorized to solicit on-the-job for monetary contribution or pledges.

c. Local fund-raisers will not be conducted by individuals while on duty.

d. All individuals involved with fund-raising must comply with DOC 5500.7-R, DOD joint Ethics Regulation. Specific questions should be directed to garrison ethics officer.

e. The POC for all religious fund-raising requests is the Garrison Chaplain's Office, 288-6543.

6. **PROPONENT:** The Directorate of Family and Morale, Welfare, and Recreation is the proponent for this policy.

7. **EXPIRATION:** This policy memorandum supersedes previous policies issued by the Garrison Commander and will remain in effect until superseded or rescinded.
