SUBJECT: World War II (WWII) Facilities on Fort Hood

1. **PURPOSE:** Define the policy for the discontinued use of WWII facilities.
2. **BACKGROUND:** The goal is to demolish WWII facilities by FY17. Fort Hood's demolition strategy is designed to maximize centrally funded programs like the Facility Reduction and Military Construction, Army Programs. WWII facilities do not meet anti-terrorism/force protection requirements, are not energy efficient, and are maintenance intensive. They offer little flexibility in providing the space required for office, supply, storage, classrooms, training areas, and information systems. The use of these inadequate facilities causes major disruptions to daily command, control, and operations of each unit, reducing mission capability and readiness.
3. **POLICY:** Management of WWII facilities will be adhered to as outlined below:
  - a. Vacated facilities will not be reassigned.
  - b. DPW will disconnect utilities immediately upon vacancy.
  - c. Garrison Directorates and NEC will be notified the facility is vacated in order to remove Installation Property Book items and ILAN/IT lines.
  - d. Occupied facilities will be minimally maintained to allow continued use until suitable facilities become available or facilities are constructed.
4. **EXPIRATION:** This Fort Hood Command Policy memorandum will remain in effect until superseded or rescinded.
