MEMORANDUM of Beception of Doctors RESTER and INNATIUS, Pinnish Commissioners.

February 27, 1918.

Doctor Reuter and Doctor Ignatius came to the Department this morning by appointment and presented to me their creientials from the Government of Finland. They asked that we give recognition to Finland as an independent state.

I replied that this Government was very sympathetic with Finland's aspirations for independence and that we were disposed to recognize the Government there as de <u>facto</u> and that we minoerally hoped in a short time a stable constitutional government would be established.

I further said that the Commissioners must appreciate the fact that at present it would be unwise for this Government to take any official action in view of the disorder and confusion which prevailed in Finland; but that we looked forward hopefully to a satisfactory ending of these unfortunate conditions and that when that time came I should be glad to receive them again.

I also said that I was specking unofficially and personally to them on this subject and that I was anticipating the time when I could speak with more sutherity.

The Commissioners said they were very desirous to see the President upon this subject and asked me my views as to the possibility of an interview with him.

TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES. MR.PRESIDENT: The Diet and the Government of Finland have declared Finland an Independent and Sovereign State. The union established in the year 1809 between Russia and Finland has thus ceased to exist. That union was not one founded on a cultural and historical development common to the Russian and Finnish peoples. On the contrary, the people of Finland in regard to Language, Religion, Customs, Conception of Law, & Historical past were in 1809 totally unlike the population of Russia, nor has the union had the effect of obliterating or even diminishing this dissimilarity During the last three decades, with but brief intervals, Russia has repeatedly overridden the provisions of the Constitution of Finland, solemnly guaranteed in 1809, and the aim of Russia's policy towards Finland has been the total destruction of Finland's

position, clearly defined in the said Constitution, as an autonomous entity within the Russian Dominions. Shortly after the outbreak of the world-war a detailed programme for the complete Russification of Finland was sanctioned by the supreme power in Russia. This policy has undermined the very foundation of Finland's union with Russia. The national and political selfconsciousness, fostered since remote times in the Finnish people by its historical development, has ripened into an irresistable yearning for an independent position. The long, silent struggle forced on the Finnish people in defence of their rights, repeatedly infringed by Russia, has furthermore developed the idea of independence into a definite policy. With a profound sense of its responsibility before-History the people of Finland have now proceeded to the realisation of their aspirations. The Finnish nation can entertain no besitation as to the



I have the honor to inform you that I have been appointed by the Provisional Revolutionary Government of the People's Republic of Finland to represent the interests of the said Government in the United States, particularly with reference to the vital and urgent problem of food supplies for the Finnish people. In view of the uncertainty of the political situation in Finland and Russia at this time, and particularly in view of the conflicting claims of the two rival governments in Finland. I do not at this time ask for official recognition by the Government of the United States; but speaking in behalf of the great rejority of the people of Finland, I am at this time primarily interested in helping them to secure some dispensable foodstuffs from this country to save them from actual starvation.

With this object in view I have taken the liberty of submitting an application for leave to purchase and ship certain supplies to Non. Borbert C. Moover, Food Administrator, United States Food Administration, a copy of which application I have the honor to submit herewith. I was informed by the food Administration that there was no objection on its part to the purchase and shipment of certain of the specified food products under the plan cutlined in the application above mentioned, but that such arrangement required the sanction of the State Dapartment.

I hereby respectfully submit the following applications to the State Department and urgently request speedy and favorable action thereon:

lst, For the approval by your Department of the arrangement for the purchase, shipment and distribution of such foodstuffe as outlined in the application to the Son. Herbert C. Hoover;

and, For the right to communicate by cable and letter with the Provisional Revolutionary Covernment of the People's Republic of Finland on the subject of opening credits in this country for the purchase of such food supplies and for all other matters in connection with such transaction;

3rd, For the issuance of a passport to my representative, whom I contemplate sending to Sweden and Finland for the purpose of facilitating such transactions. The said proposed

representative is a naturalized American citizen, of Finnish birth, and will make formal application for such passport immediately.







FRANKLIS D. ROCSEVELT,

President of the United States of America.

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, CREATING:

MNOW TE, That whereas a Treaty of Friendship, Commerce and Consular Rights between the United States of
America and the Republic of Finland was concluded and
signed by their respective Plenipotentiaries at Washington
on the thirteenth day of February, one thousand nine
hundred and thirty-four, the original of which Treaty is
hereto annexed;

AND WHEREAS, the Senate of the United States of America by their resolution of June 15 (Legislative day June 6), 1934 (two-thirds of the Senators present concurring therein), did advise and consent to the ratification of the said Treaty;

NCW, THEREFORE, be it known that I, Franklin D.
Roosevelt, President of the United States of America,

having seen and considered the said Treaty, do hereby, in pursuance of the aforesaid advice and comment of the Senate, ratify and confirm the same and every article and clause thereof.

IN TESTIKONY WHIREOF, I have caused the Seal of the United States of America to be hereunto affixed.

At the moment of signing the Treaty of Friendship, Commerce and Consular Rights between the United States of America and the Republic of Finland, the undersigned Planipotentiaries duly authorized by their respective Covernments have agreed as follows:

- 1) Wherever the term "consular officer" is used in this Treety it shall be understood to meen Consuls General, Consuls, Vice Consuls and Consular Agents to whom an exequatur or other dosument of recognition has been issued pursuant to the provisions of paragraph 3 of Article XIX, provided however that the quatoms courtesies accorded to consular officers under Article XXVII shell apply to consular officers en route to their post for the first time, prior to the receipt of an exequatur.


