FORT LEE POLICY NO. 04-05 NOV 21 2011

SUBJECT: Alcoholic Beverages Policy

- 1. Reference: AR 215-1, Chapter 10, Military Morale, Welfare and Recreation Programs and Nonappropriated Fund Instrumentalities, 24 September 2010.
- 2. Purpose: Reference above requires Commanders to conduct and make available to personnel under their command, programs that discourage irresponsible use of alcoholic beverages, reduce or eliminate alcohol-related incidences and promote responsible social behavior, such as the Designated Driver or Dial-A-Ride Programs. This policy supports the intent of the regulation plus delegates to specific unit commanders and 06 Colonels the responsibility to control the use of alcoholic beverages within their units, facilities and organizations.

3. Policy:

- a. Scope: This policy applies to all Department of Defense (DoD) military, civilians and families who work and live on Fort Lee.
- b. On Fort Lee the minimum age to purchase, drink or possess alcoholic beverages, to include low-content alcoholic beverages, is 21 years of age. Anyone on Fort Lee who is not at least 21 years of age is not permitted to purchase, consume, possess or transport alcoholic beverages. This is consistent with the laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia.
- c. Furthermore, military and DoD civilian personnel will not consume or be served alcoholic beverages by the drink while on duty (during the individual's assigned duty hours) on or off post. On-duty status is determined by the Soldier's commander or supervisor and is not necessarily related to uniform wear or the normal duty hours for Fort Lee. Exceptions to this policy are authorized for appropriate occasions and ceremonies such as organization days, picnics and retirement and promotion parties. At no time during these occasions, whether held on or off post, will underage military or DoD civilians consume alcoholic beverages. This does not restrict packaged sales intended for off-duty consumption.
- d. In accordance with AR 215-1, Commanders and Directors of tenant activities, Colonels (06 and above) are authorized to approve requests (see enclosure) from personnel under their command and control to consume alcoholic beverages while on duty participating in appropriate occasions and ceremonies. Further delegations of this authority are not authorized.

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- e. On-duty military or DoD civilians participating in appropriate occasions and ceremonial activities outside Fort Lee are bound by this policy and the laws and ordinances relative to the locality in which the activity is being held.
- f. The Garrison Commander will approve locations where alcohol may be consumed on post in accordance with AR 215-1, paragraph 10-3, which are not within the direct command and control of another Commander (06 and above). This includes locations such as recreation centers, troop-dining halls, civilian FMWR activities supported by NAF and catered events on post where alcoholic beverages are authorized; i.e., Outdoor Recreation facilities/picnic areas.
- g. This policy is not intended to affect the ability of any concessionaire, licensee or franchisee to employ individuals to lawfully serve and sell alcoholic beverages on Fort Lee.
- 4. Commanders and supervisors at all levels are responsible for educating and informing their Soldiers and civilian employees about this policy, the dangers of alcohol and its affect on Army readiness and the penalties related to violation of civil and military law regarding the use of alcohol. Responsibility includes establishing programs to discourage and eliminate irresponsible use of alcoholic beverages and alcohol-related incidents on Fort Lee.
- 5. This policy supersedes Fort Lee Policy No. 04-05 dated 22 July 2009.
