Student Use of Medication during the School Day

Please do not send medications, cough drops, chap stick, etc... with your child to school.

The school nurse accommodates parent requests for medication to be administered during the school day. According to DoDEA Health Service Guide, DS Manual 2942.0, school personnel may administer medications when certain criteria are met.

In order for school personnel to administer medications during school hours, the attached

form MUST be provided to the school signed by the parent and a physician.

The medication will be in the original container, properly labeled by the pharmacy or

physician. Medications must be brought to the school by the parent.

All medications will remain at the school for the duration of the prescription. Any changes in the medication, dosage, or frequency will necessitate a new form and a new, labeled container.
