ANGOLA

THE MINERAL INDUSTRY OF ANGOLA

Angola's mineral industry was dominated by diamond and petroleum production. Other mineral commodities produced in the country included cement, granite, marble, and, salt. Undeveloped mineral resources included copper, gold, gypsum, iron ore, lead, lignite, manganese, mica, nickel, peat, phosphate rock, silver, and zinc.

The Ministério de Geologia e Minas is the Government entity responsible for negotiating mineral rights contracts, for enforcing mining laws, and for conducting geologic surveys. All mineral rights in Angola belong to the state, and all mining and prospecting contracts must be approved by the Council of Ministers. Corpo Especial de Fiscalização y Segurança de Diamantes is the Government agency responsible for overseeing the diamond sector. Empresa Nacional de Diamantes de Angola E.P. (Endiama), which was the Government-owned diamond company, is responsible for creating partnerships with international companies prospecting for diamond and is a partner in all diamond ventures. Sociedade Nacional de

Combustíveis de Angola (Sonangol) is the Government-owned company responsible for petroleum exploration and production.

Production

In 2007, crude petroleum production increased by about 22.5% to reach nearly 629 million barrels compared with about 514 million barrels produced in 2006. Diamond production increased by 5.7% to reach 9.7 million carats compared with 9.18 million carats in 2006, and granite production increased by 31.4% to 46,000 cubic meters compared with a revised 35,000 cubic meters in 2006.
