REPORT OF THE AUDIT DIVISION ON THE BUTLER '76 COMMITTEE

1. Background

A. Overview

This report is based upon an audit of the Butler '76 Committee ("the Committee") undertaken by the Audit Division of the Federal Election Commission in accordance with the Commission's audit policy to determine whether there has been compliance with the provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as accended ("the Act"). The audit was conducted pursuant to Section Aer(a)(3)of Title 2 of the United States Code, which directs the Commission to make from time to time audits and field investigations with respect to reports and statements filed under the provisions of the Act.

The Committee registered with the Federal Election Commission on January 20, 1976 in support of the Honorable M. Caldwell Eather, a candidate for the office of Representative from the Sixth contressional District of Virginia. On January 20, 1976, the Committee cas designated by the Candidate as his principal campaign committee for the 1976 election. The Committee maintains its headquarters in Reamone, Virginia.

The audit covered the period January 20, 1976 through June 30. 1977, the final coverage date of the latest report filed by "" Committee at the time of the audit. During that period. "The committee reported beginning cash-on-hand of \$-0-, total receipts of \$10.000.05. total expenditures of \$63,600.71 and ending cash of \$0.051.54.

This audit report is based on documents and working papers supporting each of its factual statements. They form part of the record upon which the Commission based its decisions on the matters in this report and were available to Commissioners and appropriate staff for review.
