It consists of a closed basin and does not exhibit any discernable surface connection to the Wild Rice River. It is not within a floodplain where hydrologic exchanges occur with the Wild Rice. The wetland lacks a nexus to insterstate or foreign commerce. Ecological connectivity is inconclusive and speculative. Therefore, it is determined that the site is isolated and nonjurisdictional under current guidance and policy.
