Hundreds of Smart Students Set To Try for Nevada Science Bowl Title

The real bowl game is Saturday, not Sunday! Nevada Science Bowl!

Hundreds of the smartest high school students from around the Southwest will test themselves this Saturday in the Nevada Science Bowl. The Nevada Science Bowl is the premiere academic competition in Nevada. It features a fast-paced "Jeopardy-style" format starring 32 high school teams from Nevada, California, and Utah.

Nevada Science Bowl will be held at VegasPBS, 3050 E. Flamingo, starting at 7:00 a.m. on Saturday, February 2, 2013. Double-elimination matches will continue throughout the day until a champion is crowned at about 5:00 p.m.

Participants join 15,000 other high school students across the United States in an effort to qualify for the finals of the U.S. Department of Energy's annual National Science Bowl®, the largest and most prestigious science competition.

The teams will test their knowledge of astronomy, biology, chemistry, earth science, mathematics and physics. The regional champions win \$5000 for their school's math or science departments, and will continue on to the U.S. Department of Energy's National Science Bowl in Washington, D. C. in April.
