The New Parent Support Program is a professional team of nurses and social workers who provide supportive and caring services to military families who are expecting or those with children under the age of six. We have trained, supervised Home Visitors who have extensive knowledge of the issues confronting parents unique to the challenges of military life. Parenting Classes

Unfortunately, kids don't come with instruction manuals. This class discusses topics, including communication, self-esteem, safety, and discipline, that are designed to make your life easier and help you raise healthy, cooperative children. Please call for dates and times.

Class topics include everything from keeping your baby safe, taking care of yourself as a parent, dealing with crying, bathing and caring for your baby, as well as resources for the whole family. This service assists families during significant periods of their lives. Families are met in their home to provide a safe and familiar environment. Parents have the opportunity to discuss parenting topics such as nutrition, age-appropriate discipline, child development, and age-appropriate play.
