Visitors

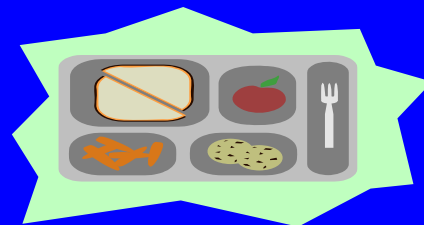
