




ESGR

Employer Support of the Guard and Reserve (ESGR) is a Department of Defense volunteer organization. We provide free education, consultation, and if necessary, mediation for employers of Guard & Reserve employees. The nation's Reserve components (referring to the total of all National Guard members and Reserve forces from all branches of the military) comprise approximately 46 percent of our total available military manpower. The current National Defense Strategy indicates that the National Guard and Reserve will be full partners in the fully integrated Total Force. Our Reserve forces will spend more time away from the workplace defending the nation, supporting a demanding operations tempo and training to maintain their mission readiness. In this environment, civilian employers play a critical role in the defense of the nation by complying with existing employment laws protecting the rights of workers who serve in the Reserve component.

ESGR was established in 1972 to promote cooperation and understanding between Reserve component members and their civilian employers and to assist in the resolution of conflicts arising from an employee's military commitment. It is the lead DoD organization for this mission under DoD Directive 1250.1.

Today, ESGR operates through a network of hundreds of volunteers throughout the nation and Guam, Puerto Rico, the Virgin Islands and Europe. ESGR Mission - Gain and maintain active support from all public and private employers for the men and women of the National Guard and Reserve. The local ESGR committee has been active in



NEED EXTRA CASH?

EARN UP TO \$2000 FOR EACH NEW RECRUIT WHO ENLISTS AND REPORTS TO BASIC TRAINING!

Effective immediately, the Guard Recruiting Assistant Program (G-RAP) is pleased to welcome eligible Retirees to apply and become Recruiting Assistants for the Army National Guard. What is an 'eligible' Retiree? Currently a Retiree with 20 years of military service with a retirement letter from the Army National Guard may submit an application to G-RAP. Retirement orders must be dated six months or more prior to G-RAP application. How does a Retiree apply? By visiting our website (www.guardrecruitingassistant.com), reading over the program information, and clicking on "Apply Now". By indicating a Retiree status, instructions are given to provide the required documents to be faxed and verified prior to acceptance. How does a Retired RA obtain recruiting items to hand out to potential Soldiers? Once hired and trained, RAs have access to the on-line promotional store, Guard Mission Zone, to choose which free items to have sent to them. What other incentives does a Retired Recruiting Assistant qualify for? Recruiting Assistants may also qualify for limited-time promotions in addition to the \$2,000 payment for an enlistment. (Do you know anyone who would enjoy a big screen TV or an iPod?!) You may qualify to receive such additional incentives for each enlistment through G-RAP. If I'm not involved in unit activities anymore how do I know what the ARNG can offer a recruit today? Once you are hired to work as a RA, you will be provided with information on what the Guard has to offer a new enlistee. You will also be provided with the name and number of a local recruiter who you may choose to work with if you do not already know of a local recruiter. Can I nominate my relative to join the ARNG? Absolutely! Your friends and family are a great place to start because you only want the best for them! Does it matter if my nominee is prior service? No, anyone you feel would be a good asset to our country in the Army National Guard is a good candidate. What if I need help? G-RAP's customer service personnel are available 0700 to 1900 hours, toll-free number (1-866-566-2472) and can also be reached via email (grap@docupak.com) at your convenience.

As a Retiree, your valuable military service has already made a difference for our country. As a Recruiting Assistant you can continue to make a difference. Your influence will help to strengthen the Army National Guard, your community, and your country and earn additional income.

Retired Pay Exempt From State Tax Legislation

Your retiree's Advisory Board supported this legislative initiative but the bill was defeated. As you know, a number of states are completely or partially exempt military retired pay from state taxation. This benefit can increase real income by 3 percent to 8 percent annually, depending on the state. The following states provide a full income-tax exemption: Alabama, Alaska, Florida, Hawaii, Illinois, Kansas, Louisiana, Massachusetts, Michigan, Nevada, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, South Dakota, Tennessee, Texas, Washington, Wisconsin and Wyoming. Kentucky, Maryland, Mississippi, Missouri, North Carolina and Oregon offer partial or conditional exemptions. Please note that some other states offer general pension exemptions once you reach a certain age (usually 62 or 65), but these aren't specific military retired-pay exemptions. We will take another run at this next session. In the mean time, please keep talking to your legislators on this issue.

Need Computer Access?

At a recent Enlisted Association meeting it was brought up that not all retirees have access to the internet. Hence, they have not viewed the CD's or looked at the web sites referenced in the last "DOG TAG". For those Retirees who do not have a computer and wish to view the CD's and the WEB sites mentioned in the DOG TAG they are encouraged to check their local library or the local armory. Retiree's are authorized access to general use computers at all National Guard Armories on a space available basis.

When The Time Comes

There have been questions about family support contact after the death of a Retiree or Retiree Spouse. In some cases Retirees have not been taking full advantage of their Veteran status and in some cases overpayment is being made to surviving spouses which can cause problems. Please use the following as a guide to eliminate problems.

Prearrangements:

- 1. If veteran or spouse is to be buried in the North Dakota Veterans Cemetery or other Veteran's Cemetery they should do the following:
- A. Fill out application and file it with the Veterans Cemetery
- B. Let family members know of veteran's wishes.
- C. Let the funeral home where you have made prearrangements know of your wishes and give them a copy of your application.
- D. Veterans, spouses and dependents can be buried at the Veterans Cemetery. There is currently a fee of \$300 for spouses and dependents to be buried at the cemetery.
- 2. Make sure the Veteran has a copy of their discharge papers on file with the county. This document is needed to apply for benefits.
- 3. If you don't know where your discharge papers are, visit your County Veterans Service Officer and start the necessary paperwork to get a copy.

After A Death of a Veteran:

- 1. If Veteran is getting a pension or compensation let your Veterans Service Officer know so they can report the death to the Veterans Administration, so the family does not get an overpayment which they will have to pay back.
- 2. The funeral home or the County Veterans Service Officer will help the family fill out VA Form 21-530, Application for Burial Benefits.
- 3. The funeral home or the County Veterans Service Officer will help the family fill out VA Form 40-1330, Application for Standard Government Headstone or Marker.
- 4. If the veteran is eligible for burial expenses the funeral home will complete a burial expense sheet which is also part of the packet.
- 5. A copy of the death certificate and a copy of the discharge document is also needed as part of the packet that is forwarded to the Department of Veterans Affairs.
- 6. If the veteran has life insurance or other VA insurance, see your County Veterans Service Officer in order to complete the appropriate paperwork.


