


NTSB's Mission

NTSB is an independent federal agency, charged by Congress to investigate transportation accidents, determine probable cause, and issue safety recommendations.



























April 1, 1967 US Department of Transportation Formed Federal Aviation Administration Federal Highway Administration Federal Railroad Administration NTSB Statute stated that NTSB would be an "independent Government agency, located within the DOT, to promote transportation safety by conducting independent accident investigations..." Is there a possible conflict here?







Advantages of Independence

- Top priority and focus remains exclusively on safety
- Not influenced by politics, media, self interest groups
- Public trust, integrity and credibility
- · Acceptance by public
- Transparency the ability to look inside and see what government is doing
- Investigations that actually accomplish their intended purpose – prevent future accidents
- A safer transportation system

The Board

- 5 Members, appointed by the President, with advice and consent of the Senate
 - Staggered 5 year terms
 - No more than
 Members from same the political party





What Do Board Members Do?

- Participate in Board Meetings
 - Deliberate Accident Findings, Determine Probable Cause, Issue Safety Recommendations
 - Adopt "Most Wanted List"
 - Adopt Safety Studies
- Vote on Opinions and Orders
- Congressional and Legislative Testimony
- Advocate Safety Issues
- Serve as NTSB Spokesperson on Major Accidents
