LIEUTENANT COLONEL AARON W. WOLF is a native of Poynette, Wisconsin. He was commissioned into the Corps of Engineers in September 1994 out of the University of Wisconsin at Stevens Point.

He has served in a wide range of positions. He served as platoon leader and company executive officer in A Company, 19th Engineer Battalion (Corps Mech), Fort Knox, Kentucky. He was selected to serve as instructor/writer for the Engineer Basic Course, Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri. After attending the Engineer Advance Course, he was chosen to serve as the 1st Battalion, 4th Infantry (OPFOR) Regimental Engineer at Hohenfels, Germany. He then joined the 130th Engineer Brigade (Combat Mech) in Hanau, Germany, where he served as the brigade maintenance officer prior to commanding the 320th Engineer Company (Topographic). Returning to the States, Wolf served in the 3rd Battalion, 340th Infantry Regiment (Training) as the Engineer and Operations Officer which supported the 32nd Infantry Brigade (Wisconsin National Guard). He then returned to Germany to serve as the Operations Officer of the 15th Engineer Battalion (Construction) and commander of the 243rd Engineer Detachment (Construction Management Team). Wolf has deployed four times with missions in support of Afghanistan, Iraq, and Kosovo.

His military education includes the U.S. Army Engineer Officer Basic Course and Engineer Office Advance Course, Combined Arms Service Staff School, Command and General Staff College, and the NATO Engineer Staff Officer Course. He holds a Master of Science in Engineering Management from the University of Missouri at Rolla and a Baccalaureate of Science in Cartography from the University of Wisconsin at Stevens Point.

Wolf's military awards include the Bronze Star Medal with two oak leaf clusters, the Meritorious Service Medal with two oak leaf clusters, the Army Commendation Medal with one oak leaf cluster, the Joint Service Achievement Medal, the Army Achievement Medal with one oak leaf cluster, the Overseas Service Ribbon with numeral 5, and various campaign medals. He has been awarded the Combat Action Badge, Basic Parachutist Badge, and Air Assault Badge.

Wolf is married and has three children.
