#### The Goal of U.S. Assistance

# U.S. assistance aims to help Timor-Leste become a stable, secure, democratic, and prosperous country

- Strengthening key foundations of governance
- Accelerating economic growth
- Improving the health of Timorese people, especially women and children

The U.S. also remains committed to responding to Timor-Leste's humanitarian needs in times of emergencies, and has to date provided nearly \$9 million in direct response to the 2006 crisis.






#### Success Stories Exporting Agricultural Products

- Cooperativa Café Timor (CCT) exports \$7m/year of premium organic coffee to Starbucks & other world markets
- CCT developing new exports: e.g., cloves & vanilla to McCormick's
- CCT cattle exports to Indonesia surpassed \$150,000 in 2007
- \$250,000 of candlenut oil exported to Hawai'i by local company Acelda

#### Success Stories Generating Employment



CCT's sorting facility in Dili. Most of the seasonal workers CCT employs for sorting coffee beans are women.

- Temporary Employment Program (TEP) launched by USAID & UNTAET in 2000 employed 63,000 people through physical rehabilitation projects
- CCT provides employment to its 22,000 farmermembers, 3,500 seasonal processing workers & 300 full-time staff





#### Success Stories Strengthening Governance

- Since 2001, over \$10m of electoral assistance for successful *suco* (2004) & national (2007) elections
- Helped establish Office of Provedor for Human Rights & Justice
- Support to legal aid providers resolved 200 cases in 2007

#### Success Stories Improving the Health of the Timorese People

- Over 1.2 million patients treated by CCT's
  11 fixed and 28 mobile clinics since 2000
- Over 85,000 treated bednets distributed to children under 5, utilization as high as 94%
- Established 1st nat'l HIV/AIDS program, led to 5-yr., \$9m million Global Fund grant
- In August 2006, USNS Mercy treated 4,500 patients & performed 40 "complex" surgeries





#### GoTL 2008 National Priorities & U.S. Assistance (1) Public Safety & Security

- PNTL/F-FDTL Professionalized & Earn Public Trust
  - Investigative training for PNTL & customs/immigration officers (ILEA, ICITAP, UNODC)
  - Development of logistical capacity w/in F-FDTL (DS2)
  - Professional military education/training, incl. English language instruction, for F-FDTL (DoD)
- Access to Justice
  - Project to strengthen administrative capacity of various justice sector institutions, including Office of Provedor (MSD)
  - Legal information/aid; access to dispute resolution/mediation services, targeting women & other disadvantaged citizens (TAF)
  - Public awareness/training to combat trafficking in persons (IOM/Alola)





#### GoTL 2008 National Priorities & U.S. Assistance (2) Social Protection & Solidarity, (3) Addressing Needs of Youth

- Support to & Reintegration of IDPs
  - \$2.5m of non-food humanitarian assistance since April 2006 (CARE, CRS, others)
  - \$4.35m of emergency food aid since April 2006, incl. to IDPs (U.S. is largest donor to WFP – 18% of total contributions)
  - Exploring additional assistance for shelter (DoD)
- Supporting Youth
  - Peace education for pre-secondary school students (CARE)
  - Peace building for youth on suco councils (Mercy Corps)
  - Donations of sporting equipment for district youth





#### GoTL 2008 National Priorities & U.S. Assistance (4) Employment & Income Generation

- Employment Generation
  - CCT: 22,000 members, 3,500 seasonal workers, 300 staff (NCBA)
  - New 3-yr., \$5m project to provide 2,500 rural youth w/ skills development & onthe-job training (EDC)
- Private Sector Development
  - Project to strengthen agribusiness, financial & commercial services, business enabling environment (DSP)
  - New 5-yr., \$10m project to provide land tenure security & property rights (ARD)
- Agriculture & Food Security
  - ➢ NCBA, DSP, WFP
  - 1-year agribusiness certificate program at 3 ag high schools (Land O'Lakes)
  - Development of Candlenut Enterprises (CRS)
  - Exploring Food for Progress program (USDA)





#### GoTL 2008 National Priorities & U.S. Assistance (5) Improving Social Service Delivery

### Education

- Introduction of basic business/economics concepts in primary school curriculum; piloted in private schools (Junior Achievement)
- University scholarships: East-West Center, Fulbright
- English language instruction

#### • Health

- Delivery of key maternal, child, & newborn health interventions at district, sub-district, community, and household levels (TAIS, HAI)
- Expand knowledge of family planning methods & services (HAI)





#### GoTL 2008 National Priorities & U.S. Assistance (6) Clean & Effective Government

- Government Accountability, Transparency & Integrity
  - Support to Office of Provedor (MSD)
  - Project to strengthen independent media, including specialized journalism training on business & economy, development of culture of investigative journalism (ICFJ)
  - New 3-yr. project to develop local quantitative research skills, e.g., corruption perceptions survey (Democracy Int'l)

Timor-Leste remains eligible for a compact, BUT


- scores below median on Control of Corruption indicator, a "hard hurdle," and

#### Maintaining MCA Eligibility & U.S. Assistance: Ruling Justly


