Colonel Victor Harmon Commander, Distribution Management Center (DMC)

COL Victor Harmon assumed command of the DMC July 2011. He is a native of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania and received his commission as a Second Lieutenant in the Transportation Corps through the ROTC program at Howard University in Washington D.C. in 1986.

Upon graduation, COL Harmon worked for a year as a staff accountant for the international accounting firm Peat Marwick (KPMG). Prior to assuming command of the Distribution Management Center, Army Sustainment Command on 14 July 2011, he served as Executive Officer to the Army Materiel Command Deputy Chief of Staff, G-3/5 at Fort Belvoir.

COL Harmon's past assignments cover a variety of leadership and staff positions. His initial assignment was in Germany where he served as a Platoon Leader and Company Executive Officer in the 181st Transportation Battalion, followed by selection as Aide-de-Camp to the Commanding General, 3rd Corps Support Command in Wiesbaden. His next assignment was Proponency Officer in the Office of the Chief of Transportation, Fort Eustis, Virginia. COL Harmon then commanded the 1098th Transportation Company, 7th Transportation Group, Fort Eustis, Virginia. During this time, he deployed his company to Port-au-Prince, Haiti in support of Operation Uphold Democracy. Following company command, he participated in the Training with Industry program where he worked with Sealand Container Shipping Company in Portsmouth, Virginia. After this assignment, COL Harmon worked as an Assignment Officer at PERSCOM (Human Resources Command) in Alexandria, Virginia. He next served as the 1st Cavalry Division Transportation Officer (DTO) where he was extremely involved in the division's redeployment from Bosnia.



He then served as the Executive Officer for the 615th Aviation Support Battalion, 1st Cavalry Division. Following his time at Fort Hood, COL Harmon was sent to the Combined Arms Doctrine Directorate, Combined Arms Center, Fort Leavenworth, Kansas where he initially worked as a Concept Developer and then as the directorate Executive Officer. COL Harmon then commanded 704th Brigade Support Battalion, 4th Brigade Combat Team (BCT), 4th Infantry Division (Mechanized) from January 2005 to June 2007. While in battalion command, he led his unit through a major transformation and through a yearlong deployment to Operation Iraqi Freedom 05-07 in Baghdad. After command, he served as the Transportation Branch Chief at the Army Human Resources Command in Alexandria, Virginia.

COL Harmon is a graduate of the Transportation Officer Basic and Advanced Courses, the Combined Arms and Services Staff School, the Command and General Staff College and the Industrial College of the Armed Forces (ICAF). His civilian education includes a BBA in Accounting from Howard University, a MS in Administration from Central Michigan University, and a MS in National Resource Strategy from ICAF.

COL Harmon's decorations include the Bronze Star Medal, Meritorious Service Medal, the Army Commendation Medal, the Army Achievement Medal, Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal, Iraqi Campaign Medal, Global War on Terrorism Expeditionary and Service Medals, Humanitarian Service Medal, Armed Forces Reserve Medal, Army Service Ribbon, Overseas Service Ribbon, the Parachutist Badge and the Military Order of Saint Christopher.

COL Harmon is married and they have four children.
