

- Forecast:
 - Alaskan winters typically see minimal wildland fire activity. February through May fire potential is expected to be normal.
- Factors:
 - Alaska is out of fire season; fuels are frozen and cloaked in ample snow cover, and will remain so for the winter, keeping fire activity minimal.
 - Below normal temperatures have occurred throughout much of the state, though February looks to begin with more moderate weather. However, mid-winter temperatures do not have a large impact on fire potential.



• So far this winter, precipitation and snowpack are a little on the low side, but not excessively below average for most of the state.
