Information and Referral (I & R): Army Community Service (ACS) Information, Referral and Follow Up Program provides commanders, Soldiers, Department of the Army civilians and their Family members with information regarding military and civilian community resources. Military Family Life Consultants (MFLC'S): MFLC's provide a free, anonymous and confidential short-term problem solving service available to all ID card holders Consultants work on a first name basis and keep no records. CIV 01753-79-4691 (0800 to 2000)

New Parent Support Program (NPSP): Supports and educates parents regarding pregnancy, delivery, newborns, and toddlers up to three years of age. Also, provides home visits and playgroups

Relocation and Loan Closet: This program is offered for arriving and departing personnel. It provides basic housekeeping items on temporary loan for sixty (60) days. This program produces welcome packets which are available through Army Community Service.

Sexual Assault Prevention and Response Program: Sexual Assault Response Program is a campaign called I. A.M. Strong. The I.A.M. stands for Intervene Act Motivate. I. A.M. STRONG is the Army's campaign to combat sexual assaults by engaging all Soldiers in preventing sexual assaults before they occur.
