Subject matter experts that are carefully selected to ensure they are fully qualified in the commodity areas they evaluate, train and assist.

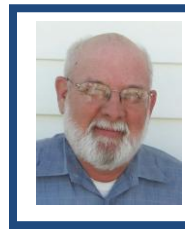
What We Do

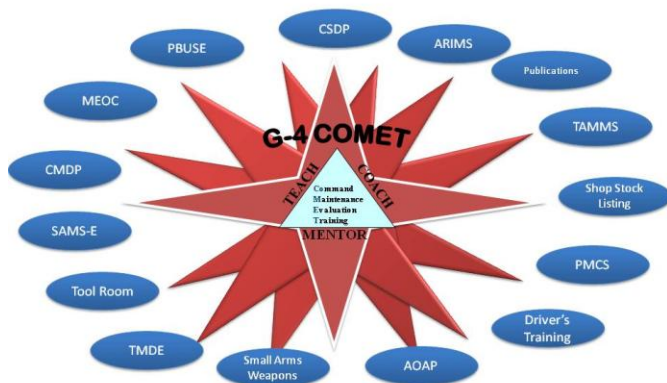

PBUSE Access Roles

Do you know who has access to your Unit Level Files on PBUSE? Would you like to know? This should be a check all Supply Sergeants perform on PBUSE. You might see some people that have access that have no need to be there. People that left the unit 6 months ago, old Company Commanders, old Executive Officers, etc.

The answers to these questions are easy to find. Once logged in, open the "Administration" menu. Now select "User Roles - View/Status/Modify/Add". The screen you default to is the one you want (the "View" tab at top of screen). Now click "Search" at bottom of the screen. Once the search screen populates, in the lower left side you will see a "UIC" area. Type in your unit's UIC and click "Submit". The results of your search will populate on your screen.

Whichever name is highlighted in gray, the roles they hold in PBUSE will be displayed for that person in the lower portion of the screen. You will be looking for the people with "Unit UIC" information including your unit's UIC. Do not be concerned with people that hold "Staff UIC" roles. Those will be your Battalion, Brigade, Division, and other staff roles. You can go through each person on the list by clicking on the "SEQ ID" hyperlink for each person on the list and review which roles they hold in PBUSE.

You should be looking out for who holds the role of "Company Commander" and "Executive Officer" for your particular "Unit UIC". These are key roles for one reason, and one reason only. These roles in PBUSE are able to add, modify, and delete users for PBUSE Access for your unit. No other role in PBUSE can perform this. If you find nobody holds either of these roles for your UIC, we suggest the Supply Sergeant for the Company add an additional role for themselves of "Company Commander". This will open the window for the Supply Sergeant to perform maintenance in the user roles area for their unit. You will have to go through your Property Book Officer to get this additional role assigned.

PBUSE Access Roles (continued)

So what do we do about people that should not have roles for our UIC (people that have left the unit)? Have the person with "Company Commander" or "Executive Officer" roles for your UIC delete the users from PBUSE. If you would like help with this procedure, feel free to call the PBUSE Training Team at (270) 798-5400. Please leave a voicemail if you do not get an answer (we turn the ringer off to prevent disturbing the classroom).

All SAMS-E operators across Ft. Campbell should be operating off the new Software Change Package (SCP 13.01.06) by the time this newsletter is published. Our SAMS-1E course is updated with all of the new changes and we look forward to seeing you in our next class. One of the biggest changes is the User Created Class Codes. Now, instead of creating a class code for every piece of equipment that a Soldier must be licensed on, the EIC (End Item Code) defines the equipment. We have fielded several calls regarding this subject because, as we all know, there are still pieces of equipment that Soldiers must be licensed on that are not defined by an EIC; one example would be a Gator. The new SCP will still allow you to create class codes that do not have an EIC and the range (UA-UZ, ZA-ZZ) may still be applied. For additional information refer to the SAMS-E End User Manual, Para 5.6.1 and don't hesitate to call Charles or Kristin for any additional assistance.

Linking Sub-Systems

Units need to ensure that they are linking sub-systems to prime systems in SAMS-E; all sub-systems need to be loaded in SAMS-E as end items so they can be linked to the prime system. IAW AR 700-138, when any sub-system or the prime system is NMC the down time is tracked for the whole system (prime and sub-systems) This process is done in SAMS-E under subsystem management see SAMS-E End User Manual Para 5.4 for instructions.

Component Management

Often we find unit supply creating component listing and shortage annexes manually on DA Forms 2062's and excel spreadsheet. Through PBUSE, users can create component listings and shortages. You can find this information in the PBUSE EUM Section 6 – CATALOG.

The Component function Under the Catalog Menu provides the capability to view the Master Component Listings, received from the Logistics Support Activity (LOGSA), copy component data, and to create and maintain component records for your current UIC. Building your components on PBUSE can be a time consuming process but the results will save you time in the future. Once you build your components on PBUSE you can initiate request from Component Management and can generate a request for a shortage and update your shortage annexes at the same time.
