Viewing mentoring as a promotion vehicle	To recognize that effective mentoring seeks to develop protégés to perform mission with excellence
Assuming that is is the mentor's responsibility to define your goals and aspirations	To become conscious that you have to be motivated and have goals for you and your mentor to shape and move forward
Misusing your mentor as an ally for personal issues	To be clear about your ethical responsibility in choosing a mentor to guide you in achieving your best hopes
Failing to contribute to the growth of your mentor as it relates to cross- gender, racial or other interest group lines	To develop a balanced relationship where both you and your mentor are mutually engaged in strengthening your respective cultural competencies
Selecting a mentor on the basis of stereotypes	To be weary of presumptions and prejudgements that might close the door to a fruitful relationship
Neglecting your obligations to provide feedback on how mentoring strategies are being applied to growth challenges	To become aware that mentors, as people, need affirmation and feedback that what they are doing is valuable in the lives of their protégés
Becoming emotionally possessive of your mentor	To understand that a mentor with a generous, caring spirit can be effective with more than one protégé
