PROGRAM OUTREACH ACHIEVEMENTS: APRIL-JUNE 2012

Overview

The 2011 Community Involvement Plan (CIP) listed several ways for the Hunters Point Naval Shipyard (HPNS) cleanup team to reach out to the HPNS community. In 1988, the Department of Defense created the Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC) Program to oversee the cleanup and transfer of military bases to public or private groups for redevelopment.

HPNS was added to the BRAC Program in 1998, and the Navy has been working since that time to clean up hazardous waste created by former shipyard use.
