In 1988, the Department of Defense created the Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC) Program to oversee the cleanup and transfer of military bases to public or private groups for redevelopment.

HPNS was added to the BRAC Program in 1998, and the Navy has been working since that time to clean up hazardous waste created by former shipyard use. The HPNS cleanup team includes the United States Navy, the United States Environmental Protection Agency, the California Department of Toxic Substances Control, and the San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board.
