Small clues to identify past attempted or successful break-ins



Be aware of people looking lost or loitering. They may have no other reason for being there than to check out your house.

Consider installing an alarm system. If you do, make sure signs and decals are prominently displayed.



Do not accept any suspicious packages. Only accept packages from the normal delivery personnel. Packages without a return should be considered suspicious.

Park in a garage, if possible; if not, park in a well-lit area. Keep high value items (iPods, GPS, etc) out of plain view.

Home Security Awareness Guide

Recognize & Report Suspicious Activity to the Military Police

Lock doors, windows and shutters, especially at night and when not at home and install deadbolts on main doors. Burglars look for easy access first. Don't "hide keys under the mat." Lock the garage too, especially if it provides access to the house. Doors should have a peep hole to identify people.

Look for anything around your building out of the ordinary such as:

- Soil that's been disturbed.
- Telephone boxes tampered with.
- Electrical boxes tampered with.
- Gas lines, tampered with or packages left near



- Transformers that suddenly have additional devices attached.

- Torn screens and/or broken windows or those that appear to have been forced open or are just unlocked.

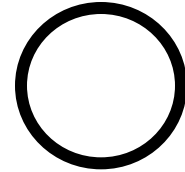
Lighting. Consider installing motion sensor lighting at entry areas, in front and back, and near garages.

Large shrubs and vines can potentially conceal a package; be sure to keep them trimmed to reduce this possibility.

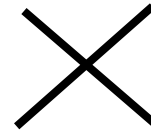


LOOK UP! when doing security sweeps. People have a tendency not to look above eye

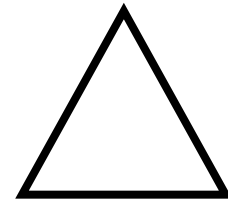
Tagging. Look for symbols on fences, doors, etc. that identify your home as a potential target. Call the MPs and try to cover up the symbol.
