PTECs are nationally or multinationally sponsored education and training institutions which are united under a single concept that is endorsed by the North Atlantic Council and recognized by NATO.

PTECs offer courses, seminars and workshops to *civilian, police and military personnel*, providing classroom and field education, training and instruction in diverse areas consistent with the objectives and priorities of NATO's policy on partnerships.
