FEDERAL EXECUTION DATE SET FOR BRUCE CARNEIL WEBSTER

The Federal Bureau of Prisons has set April 16, 2007, as the date on which to carry out the death sentence of inmate Bruce Carneil Webster, at the Federal Correctional Complex, Terre Haute, Indiana.

Webster was found guilty of Kidnapping Resulting in Death and Aiding and Abetting, in violation of Title 18 U.S.C. Section 1201(a)(1) and Title 18 U.S.C. Section 2; Conspiracy to Commit Kidnapping, in violation of Title 18 U.S.C. Section 1201(c); and Use and Carrying a Firearm During and in Relation to a Crime of Violence and Aiding and Abetting, in violation of Title 18 U.S.C. Section 924(c)(1) and Title 18 U.S.C. Section 2. A jury recommended the death penalty, and, as required by federal law, U.S. District Court Judge Terry R. Means, of the Northern District of Texas, formally imposed the sentence of death on September 24, 1996.

On December 5, 2006, the Federal Bureau of Prisons formally notified Webster, in writing, of his scheduled execution date. The execution will occur at 7:00 a.m., Eastern Standard Time.

In accordance with federal regulations, the method of execution will be lethal injection.
